Issac Kehimkar is working with the Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) since 1979. He is presently the Deputy Director (Natural History), BNHS. He has written books on nature which include Moths - an Introduction, Common Butterflies of India, Incredible Insects, and Common Indian Wild Flowers as well as several photographs and articles by him are published in various nature publications. He is also a Fulbright Scholar (2008), and recipient of the Green Teacher Award, 2014 from **Sanctuary** Asia and Kirloskar Vasundhara Award, 2015. book, The Book of Indian Butterflies, he wrote in 2008 that eventually became a BNHS's best-seller, butterflying in India has been revolutionized. Isaac Kehimkar, often affectionately called as the "Butterfly Man of India" placed the power of knowledge in the hands of amateurs who started chasing and photographing the winged jewels, like never before. His ease of connecting with the masses struck the chord in such a way that after his book's launch there was a spurt of field guides on local butterflies across the country.
