**Preamble**

UDCS, perhaps the oldest Department of Computer Science in India, is in the 5th decade of its existence. It has launched a specialization in data science and electives in computer assisted music learning. Classes take place on weekends, in the flipped classroom mode.

This workshop is for interested persons from both music and computing to gather, exchange research ideas and interact further. We hope to have contributions on aspects of music and its science, engineering, re-engineering and reverse engineering.

**Significance**

CAMAD is an emerging field of interdisciplinary research, with applications in domains ranging from the entertainment industry to the medical sciences. Our emphasis is on exploring the computational aspects of Indian classical music and dramatics (ICM). The fine arts speak their own language. We will be exploring possibilities of employing speech and NLP research for music and dramatics. This workshop is an international forum for researchers to present their work related to technical, theoretical, experimental and experiential observations.

**Objectives**

To identify research problems, map them to research groups, groom young researchers to come up with research results in the near term, compile the presentations and publish a monograph with ISSN.

If you are interested in music, dramatics, language, linguistics, computer science and technology, this event is for you.

**Highlights**

This workshop is dedicated to our Amrut-mahotsavi Professor Hari Sahasrabudde of Pune, to honour his pioneering contributions in computer-assisted music analysis.

Dr David Courtney of Houston, disciple of Ustad Sheikh Dawood Khan of Hyderabad, is a Tabla teacher and accomplished researcher since the 1970s in the computerization of ICM. He will demonstrate signal processing ideas and guide the participants.

Models described in authentic ancient Indian texts will be discussed.

**Resources**

Professor Preeti Rao of IITB and Professor Suvarnalata Rao of NCPA are known for signal processing of ICM. Dr Sangeeta Chakrabarty of Goa has a in automatic articulation of Bharatnatyam. Dr Siby Abraham has guided a PhD at UDCS on the automation of Taal. Dr Anjali Nigwekar of Shivaji University has developed Haiku-Bandish. Professor Makaranad Velankar and Dr Smita Bedekar of SPPU have contributions in relation mining between lyrics and music. Mr Sandeep Bagchee of Pune, author of "Naad and Shruti," Professor Jayant Kirtane and Professor C R Rao of Hyderabad, and Professor Ramprasad Joshi of Goa have analyzed aspects of ICM. Vidushi Prem Vasant-ji, Vidushi Rajashree Shirke, Dr Ganesh Chandanshive and Dr Mangesh Bansod, have rich experience in pedagogy of music, dance, folk arts and theatre.

This workshop is a golden opportunity to listen and interact with the personalities of repute.
