All the Principals of the Arts, Science, Commerce, Engineering, Law, Architecture, Management, Fine Arts Colleges are hereby informed that the University Grants Commission has introduced a scheme entitled "Colleges with Potential of Excellence" to strengthen Under-graduate and Post-Graduate teaching programmes to encourage excellence in research in colleges and engage in outreach activities.

Proposals are invited in the prescribed proforma available in the guidelines for Colleges with Potential of Excellence from affiliated colleges fulfilling the following criteria:-

- (i) The College should be minimum 10 years old.
- (ii) The college should have been recognised under section 2(f) & 12 (B) of the UGC Act
- (iii) The college has to be an accredited one by NAAC with a minimum of 'B' Grade at the time of applying for first phase of CPE status.

(Pharmacy colleges are not eligible to be considered under this Scheme.)

The Guidelines are available on the website of UGC www.ugc.ac.in and must be perused for detailed information. The proposals will be scrutinized by a Committee consisting of the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar/Dean, College Development Council and two/three experts from outside the University to authenticate the data provided by the applicant colleges and also score the data under specific parameters as per the scoring scale available in the guidelines. Self-financing colleges can also apply but will not receive any assistance under the scheme.

Maximum 08 colleges are eligible to be recommended on order of merit on the basis of the scores obtained by them. Proposals received after 25th August, 2018 will not be considered by the University.
