Programme: DIPLOMA I in CHINESE MANDARIN (HSK 3)

Credits: 3

Duration: 80 hrs

Objectives:

1. Imparting communication skills in Chinese Mandarin for Level 3. Teaching of intermediate level of Chinese Mandarin language to students who have passed Level 2. A minimum of 600 Chinese words will be taught along with basic information on Chinese culture. Chinese characters will be introduced from this level. Students shall discuss daily academic and professional lives and manage most communication in Chinese when travelling in China.
2. Facilitation of learning of basic Chinese Mandarin language by imparting reading, writing, understanding and speaking skills by latest teaching methods.

Rationale of Diploma I Chinese Mandarin (Level 3):

Level 3 is the step into learning Intermediate level Chinese language, Learners move onto a intermediate level of learning through the integrated communicative approach. This course process requires intense interaction with the methodologies, tools and techniques of teaching, deployed in the teaching of various languages, including foreign languages.

Programme Description:

The programme shall enable the learners to communicate in Chinese at a basic level in their daily academic and professional lives. The learners will be able to recognize characters and write down the simple ones. Building on the base of Level 2, the learner will learn expression, exclamation, degree, frequency, to emphasize, remind, comfort, encourage and to express emotions etc. Communication skills of speaking, reading, listening and understanding for daily and routine uses shall be learnt. Upon successful completion, the learners shall possess the ability and skill set to further their Chinese Mandarin language studies.
