1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Analysis of this feedback contributes to improvement in terms of Teaching Methods, Teaching-Learning Process, Examination Process, Industrial Visits, Guest Lecture Arrangements, Revision in Syllabus, New Course Formation, Help in On Job Training and Internships, Projects etc.

However some departments have their individual best practices in this aspect. Some of which are (a) Student's feedback is always discussed in the Faculty meeting of the Department and the issues if any are resolved in the interest of the students, (b) A written analysis by faculty about the feedback and actions to be taken on further development, (c) The Director/Head may discuss the feedback with the faculty individually, (d) Each Departmental IQAC has student representative who also provide direct feedback and inputs, which are then discussed and implemented in the best possible way and (e) Each Departmental IQAC has teacher representative who also provide direct feedback and inputs, which are then discussed and implemented in the best possible way.

1.4.3. Curricula developed/ adopted have relevance to local/ national/ regional/ global developmental needs with learning objectives including programme outcomes, programme specific outcomes and course outcomes of all the programme offered by the university(maximum 500 words)

Various Departments and Institutes have attended to developmental needs at various levels; theoretical, research and training level. Teaching faculty ensures a multidisciplinary approach towards their learning outcomes, in order to make it practically relevant. Programme outcomes cater to the industry for e.g. the biotechnology curricula would introduce topics like Plant Tissue Culture (PTC) and Animal Tissue Culture (ATC) cater to which Tissue culture industry. Students are also prepared to understand industry specific needs and related entrepreneurial skills. The course outcome directly translates into effective placements in industries, academia and research instititutes. Many students also qualify and are absorbed by Universities abroad for higher education. To make the course locally relevant students also engage in extension activities through collaborative efforts as a part of their programme. For example the Alkesh Dinesh Mody Institute has conducted Organ Donation Drive in association with Nanavati Hospital & Speciality Care. The Institute also conducted Joy of Giving Drive wherein people have donated their books, toys and clothes for under privileged section of the society. Based on the discipline courses are designed to meet the needs of the industry such as commerce, management, banking and finance , accountancy and taxation etc. as well as the society such as understanding environment conservation, Human Rights in the Global Context, Women and Political Representation, Democracy, Pluralism and Citizenship etc. The Language based courses are designed to not only develop language proficiency but to understand the rich literary traditions, cultural know how, translation skills and research competence. Understanding the use of technology in the field is a central learning objective for e.g. a Computer Science Student would engage with ideas such as robotics and artificial intelligence, while a geography student would engage with the application of Remote Sensing and Geographic Information System, and a psychology student would learn to design their cognitive psychology experiments using computer based applications. The Choice based Credit System introduced mainly in this academic year gives students the opportunity to exercise choice in their learning goals, and also look out for interdisciplinary, ability enhancement and project based courses.

1.4.4. Institution integrates cross cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values and Professional Ethics into the Curriculum(Maximum 500 words)

Many courses have addresses issues of Environment and Sustainability, such as courses on Environmental Biotechnology, Conservation Psychology, Economics of Climate Change, Green Computing, Environment Management or a course in Political Science on Environment Conservation and Development in India. Gender and other socially relevant themes addressing human values are common across coursework and curricula in issues of human rights, political representation, feminist theories and literature, dalit literature, multiculturalism, security and terrorism, peace studies, social justice and equality, power and inequality, social class and caste

etc. These themes find space not only in literature and academic discourse, but also in disciplines acting through the medium of folk art, music, poetry, theatre etc. Students also through field based projects, field work, internships engage in social outreach programs which inculcate social sensitivity and human values. Every discipline includes in its academic programme both relevant professional and research ethics, based on standards and guidelines prescribed as best practices in the academic field.

- 1. Department wise faculty are involved directly in designing courses and related syllabi of Choice based credit System. The department also has several committees to manage Admissions, Semester Coordination, Examinations and Placements to ensure quality and smooth functioning of processes.
- 2. Every department has a departmental IQAC cell with student and teaching staff, which looks at quality practices and issues at a Departmental level. Transperency in adimission procedures are also maintained and regulated at a Departmental level as an institutional best practice.

6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment

- 6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (with in 100 words each):
 - ❖ Curriculum Development: The curriculum/ syllabus have been developed based on choice based credit system. Project based courses, interdisciplinary courses and ability enhancement courses have been introduced, along with new elective papers to carter to advancements in each field of study and related

industries. Latest books and journal articles are introduced in the reading and reference list to keep the learner uptodate with contemporary literature in the field of study. The syllabus of the courses offered by the Institute is approved by the BOS of various subjects of University of Mumbai. Some faculty members have been part of the BOS and have actively contributed in the curriculum development. In line with the approved syllabus and requirements mentioned in it course teachers plan out teaching methods, class activities and outside the class activities internships, field visits other form of practical exposures.

- * Teaching and Learning: The faculty members actively use ICT in their teaching methods. Majority of teachers use at least PPTs and audio-visual clips to aid their teaching. Faculty members use case study, student presentation and group presentation and assignment method to improve teaching-learning outcome. Teachers follow a democratic style of teaching-learning experience, where in student reading, participation, inputs to understanding are encouraged to make learning a two way, rather than a one way process. Remedial classes and additional contact hours are also assigned to meet individual needs of students, or special needs of a small group of students. Seminars, Guest lectures, Video recording of Lectures uploaded online, Workshops are organized, to enhance learning process.
- * Examination and Evaluation: Internal evaluation is conducted by course teachers and can vary from student presentations, internal test, submission of assignments or other forms depending on the requirement of the course. University teachers actively participate as members of Examination committee to ensure smooth conduct of examinations, through paper setting, translation, evaluation and moderation of papers and also being present to answer queries in the control roon on the day of their respective papers. Papers (Non-language courses) are available in English and translated in Marathi to assist regional language speaking students. Online Assessment and Evaluation through On-Screen Marking (OSM) is carried out to ensure that there is no scope for 'malpractices' in generating results with obtained marks.
- * Research and Development: University provides minimal grants for supporting minor research projects, Shashtri Indo-Canadian Organisation. Faculty are encouraged to take up major and minor projects funded by UGC, DST, Shashtri Indo-Canadian Organisation, ICSSR etc. University provides all support for research and development like sanctioning duty leaves, encouraging faculty to interact with faculty from other institutions, including those from abroad. Research seminars, symposiums, can be partially funded by departmental budgetary provisions. Several workshops are also conducted to train, enhance and update research skills of research scholars and faculty alike. The research culture in the University is ehnaced through the various seminars, symposiums and conferences which are held on a regular basis through out the year, where in cross-disciplinary participation is encouraged.
- Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation: The University has two central libraries in the fort campus and Kalina campus which is partially digitalised using softwares like 'opac' to manage a catlogue and access to books. The library also provides access to e-database. Apart from which many departments also house independent departmental libraries, with budgetary provisions to purchase subject specific books. Every departmental infrastructure is well equipped with LAN, Wifi, LCD Projectors, Laptops and Required softwares. The University also houses the Western region Instrumentation Centre, has a University Computerisation Centre and AMC's with external organisations for mantainence of instrumentation and ICT based infrastructure.
- ❖ Human Resource Management: TAU (Teachers Appointment Unit) and Establishment Section (Staff Appointment) are the relevant sections that handle the appointments at University level. University sometimes also considers the temporary appointments on basis of requirement and recommendation of Institute. The temporary appointments are for period of six-six months for non-teaching staff. Extension is granted with some break period in between two extension periods. Based on requirement and work load of the teaching staff, budgetary provisions are in place to rope in visiting faculties with different expertise to meet the teaching-learning demands. The University upon consideration may also appoint adhoc faculty (contractual positions). Retired teaching faculty may be given a honorary

position of adjunct faculty. Most departments also have positions of research assistants appointed on a full time basis, to assist in regulating academic work and processes. The Women Development Cell not only organises programmes on Gender Sensitisation and sexual harrasement, but looks into cases of sexual harrasement at the workplace. Teaching faculty are encouraged to participate in academic-development programmes like orientation course, refresher course, short term training programmes, summer schools, winter schools and training workshops. The Unions of the teaching and non teaching staff on campus are registered and activite.

- ❖ Industry Interaction / Collaboration: Based on the nature of academic programmes running in University departments, relevant industry experts are invited as resource persons for special lectures, visiting faculty, seminars, symposiums and workshops. Many of which may also be alumni of the University. Industry linkages optimize internship programmes, on field training, and field visits. The industry linkages also act as shadowing exposures which help students shape their career. For e.g. the Academy of Theatre arts has tie ups with the Marathi and Hindi theatre and Film industry, that acts as a plus point for the passout students for understand different career roles and make important career decisions. Industry linkages also facilitate placement drives and initiatives.
- * Admission of Students: Admission process is decentralized at the departmental level, regulated by a departmental admission committee and a University Nominee, which ensure fair and transparent admission process. Admissions may be based on merit CET or other DTE based centralized exmainations based on the course the Department offers. Departmental Admission committees scrutinize along with administrative staff scrutinize the forms to ensure eligibility for the course. Government rules of reservations are strictly followed. Outstation students need to complete their eligibility approval from the eligibity section of the University, till then their admission is considered provisional. Guidance is provided by departmental faculty if students are confused about which elective courses or majors to opt for or any other educational decisions. M.Phil admissions are done on the basis of merit, in line with government rules. PhD admissions are done through UGC guidelines of PET/NET/SET as basic eligibility criteria fulfilling which a selection interview is conducted.

6.2.2 : Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations:

*

- Planning and Development: Important announcements of upcoming activities and programmes are available on the university website. Major purchase of equipment, chemicals (above 1 lakh values) through e-tenders.
- ❖ Administration: Most of the official communication, intimations and coordination takes place through university email service ("all users"). University Website has link to all important administrative circulars of quick references. The University also follows a biometric attendance system for teaching and non-teaching staff. The University also launched a BIOHRM portal which can handle all employees' data, their addresses, their promotions, and their salary and leave records BIOHRM is used to manage the attendance of the employees along with their leaves. It provides the detailed information by providing the option to generate various reports. It contains menus like BIOHRM, Employee, Leaves, Attendance, Reports, Admin Reports, Utility, Forms and Help. It is directly linked to the biometric system.
- Finance and Accounts: University Staff on roll, reviecive their salaries and other remunerations through e-banking. Reinbursement and remmunerations to visiting scholars and experts mostly are done through e-banking. The finance and accounts section has a computerised system for maintaining and compiling account statements. Computerisation of receipt cash book to does online receipt printing. The system tallies day to day cash, Ipo, DD and cheques transaction. The system is used to know the due dates of FDR and interest calculation of FDR of university investments in Trust, Funds. The over time register and conveyance register of employees' are computerized. The computerised system also generates the letters to recover examination fees from defaulter colleges.
- ❖ Student Admission and Support: Admission Notifications, related circulars and display of merit list is facilitated through the University Website. The University website also has links to syllabus which potential students can go through to make informed decisions, before they seek admissions.

* Examination: Notifications for being a part of examination committee and relevant appointment letters are communicated through email. The question paper submission and uploading and communication of the paper to the exam centers is fully digitalized. UG and PG Course Examination Form filling and generation of Hall ticket is through University Digital Portal. Notification of exam time tables, centers and results is done through the university website. Important circulars related to examinations are also available on the University Website. The University also implemented OSM (On Screen Marking) for evaluation of exam papers, which is a computerized system of evaluating scanned answer booklets though software. Fox-pro Software is used for Processing result. Use of new technologies - IVRS, ICR, Intranet, etc.

In the year 2016-17 Nagindas Khandwala College of Commerce and Economics was granted autonomy.

Realizing the importance of sustainable development many activities are undertaken to make the campus environmentally friendly and students sensitive to ecological issues. A preliminary energy audit was carried

to calculate energy load by buildings and their related appliances and equipments and to suggest measures LED tubelights are being fixed for new installations. The Department of Life Sciences has an installed solar panel to supplement the electrical requirements. A solar plant has also been purchased and kept in centre for National Centre for Nanosciences and Nanotechnology and is in the process of installation. The Department of Physics have developed a Research laboratory for Renewable energy studies. The groundwater is recharged using a water recharge well.

7.2 Best Practices

- 1. Preliminary Energy Audit was carried during year 2016-2017 by Dr. Suhas Jejurikar from the National Centre for Nanoscience and Nanotechnology and his team. Following buildings were considered for the audit 1. National Centre for Nanoscience and Nanotechnology Building, 2. Pherozeshah Mehta Bhavan, 3. C.D. Deshmukh Bhavan, 4. Green Technology Building, Department of Biophysics Building and Savitribai Phule Girls Hostel Building. During the energy audit, load was allowed and actual load was calculated physically and a comparison of electrical consumption in the electrical bills from last 12 months was carried out. Load per building, per floor, per electrical appliance/ equipment was calculated. It was observed that the actual load increased for few departments due to lights, light fixtures used, air conditioning system (not maintained timely), old connecting wires as well as taping electrical connections, use of lifts, etc. Suggestions are given to replace existing lights with LEDs, use of electricity while required, use of air conditioning with regular maintenance and topping cooling gas, appreciate use of lifts provided, avoid unauthorized connections, replacement of problematic light fixtures, etc. Use of solar energy is highly recommended in order to reduce the existing cost of energy.
- 2. Clean campus initiative was Dr. Varsha Kelkar Mane from the Dept. of Biotechnology audited certain issues in regards to keeping the campus clean in lines with the SWM rules published In the Gazette of India, Part---II, Section-3, Subsection (ii) Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change

Notification, New Delhi, 2015, evaluated current practices, discussed it in the Campus Development Cell, and proposed certain changes to the University authorities along with the need for appropriate budget allocation. Current practices include waste collection from door to door, cleaning of open areas once in a month, BMC waste collection- two times a day, Pits for composting. What was proposed to be implemented by the University along with appropriate budget allocation was reviving and maintaining pits for composting, installing a composting machine, installation of bins every 50 feet and replacement of existing municipality bins. It was also suggested to the General Administrative Department (GAD) that additional efforts need to be made in line with waste collection, segregation and recycling and instructing staff quarters to segregate waste. Also creating awareness among faculty, students and residents on premises.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

We carter to a wide range of students through departments in four different campuses namely Fort, Kalina, Ratnagiri and Thane, with the Kalya Campus yet to start http://mu.ac.in/portal/about-us/ and three different Institutes namely Jamnalal Bajaj Institute of Management Studies (JBIMS) http://jbims.edu/, Garware Iinstitute of Career and Education Development (GICED) http://gicededu.co.in/ and Alkesh Dinesh Mody Institute for Financial and Management Studies (ADMIFMS) http://admi.mu.ac.in/. Research is assisted through its well equipped libraries and laboratory. Infact the University boasts of having one of the most well equipped laboratories in centres such as nanoscience, biophysics, Centre for Excellence in basic Sciences (CEBS). Researchers from different disciplines are recipients of research funding from various government agencies such as DAE BRNS, DST, UGC, ICMR, ICSSR etc. We humbly acknowledge good research and publication output in different disciplines. Infact in attempt to develop more global networks in research and education, GIAN (Global initiatives of Academic Networks) programmes were organised in the current year 2016-17. 8. Future Plans of action for next academic year (500 words)

The future plan of action for the next academic year is to move towards achieving more efficient academic and administrative processes and better outcomes. It includes the following:

- 1. Creating better ICT, Physical and Disability Friendly infrastructure. Building new hostel and staff quarters and repairs of the current infrastructure.
- 2. To go in for CAS (Career Advancement Scheme) for teaching faculty due for promotions in the next year or who had been due in the previous years. The University also plans to pursue the filling of sanctioned vacancies for teaching and non teaching staff by persuing it with state government authorities.
- 3. Streamlining shortcomings in processes in the examination systems as a result of the examination mechanisms adapting to the Onscreen Marking System implemented at a large scale in the current year, inorder to make declaration of results more efficient in the next year.
- 4. Acellerating digitalization and automation of administrative processes at different levels, and optimizing e-office initiatives.
- 5. Procrument of research based softwares such as analytical softwares (e.g. SPSS) and plagiarism softwares (e.g. turnitin) to modernize research infrastructure and engage in best practices in research.
- 6. To make admissions forms totally online for all courses offered by Mumbai University.
- 7. To realise the digital library initiatives taken by the University, which are currently in the process.
- 8. Registering a Centralised Alumni association of the University inorder get distinguished alumni of the University to re-establish stronger ties with their Alma Marter.
- 9. To form student association in the next year, through fair elections system, through the Department of Student Welfare, and increase students participation in University initiatives.
- 10. To ecourage faculty to send proposals for inviting international scholars and scientists through GIAN (Global Initiatives of Academic Networks), given the good number of GIAN programmes organised in the current year 2016-17. To encourage teaching faculty to seek research funding, and also apply for minor research grants from the University.
