# M.Phil. in African Studies

## Eligibility for admission:

- a. Masters Degree in the concerned Faculty of this University or an equivalent examination of other University.
- b. Candidate must have passed Master's Degree examination with minimum 55% marks for open category and 50% for reserved category.
- c. Candidate must have qualified PET (Ph.D. Entrance Test) of the University of Mumbai

### **Procedure for Admission:**

Candidate seeking admission for M. Phil are required to submit with their applications, statement of marks obtained at the M.A. Examination and PET examination, together with a certified copy of the same to the Director of the Centre for African Studies.

**Time of Admission:** Course starts at the beginning of every academic year i.e. in June Last Date of Admissions is usually 30<sup>th</sup> June every academic year

## **Documents Required for Admission:**

The students selected for admission should submit to the Department:

- a. An application for M. Phil registration, together with the fee prescribed
- b. M.A. Marksheet and Convocation Certificate
- c. PET Marksheet
- d. An application for a transfer certificate if he/she is transferring himself/herself to the Department from a constituent college of the University of Mumbai or a provisional eligibility certificate issued by the Registrar, University of Mumbai, if he/she is migrating to this university from other University.

### **Duration of the Course:**

The duration of the course for the degree of M. Phil will be of one and a half year. The examination in theory paper will be held at the end of two terms. A candidate will be required to submit a dissertation at the end of the third term after his registration for the degree. However, the Head of the Department may grant extension of time for submitting the dissertation up to a period of six months. Each candidate will submit (Three Hard Bound copies) of his/her dissertation to the office of the Department.
