#### Culinary trail of Maharashtra

Maharashtrian food is one of the most diverse, flavoursome, and delicious cuisines in India. Every food represents the landscape, climate, culture, and uniqueness of the region it originates from. Each dish uses a combination of aromatic spices and ingredients unique to the region, giving it a distinctive and unforgettable taste.

Maharashtra is divided into five main regions- Konkan, Desh, Khandesh, Marathwada, and Vidarbha. To the northernmost part of Maharashtra lies the Khandesh region. This region consists of the districts Dhule, Nashik, and Nandurbar. Khandeshi cuisine is by far the spiciest cuisine in Maharashtra. Dhule is known for its cultivation of chillies, hence Khandeshi cuisine is also recognized by the signature spicy 'thechas' (a condiment/ chutney made of chilli and garlic). Eggplant is also a frequently used vegetable, with a wide range of dishes like 'bharli vangi' or 'ghotleli bhaji'. Saibhaji, Shev Bhaji, Patolyanchi bhaji are some well known veg dishes from this region.

Spicy 'Tariwali' Mutton curry is also a favourite in Khandeshi cuisine. Khapar Mande, Dashmya are sweet dishes and Bibde and Kurdaya condiments that are well liked.

To the west coast of Maharashtra, beyond the mighty Sahyadri ranges, lies the Konkan region. Konkan comprises of Mumbai, Thane, Ratnagiri, Raigad, and Sindhudurg. Being a coastal region, seafood is widely eaten here. The Konkan region is known for its scrumptious fish curries and fries. It is further divided into smaller regional cuisines like Malvani and Agri. In the summer, fishermen dry the fish to preserve it for the monsoon months when seas become rough and fishing is difficult. Since coconut is easily available in this region, it is the main ingredient in many dishes. 'Kokum kadhi' is also a famous beverage consumed with everyday meals in the konkan region.

As we move further in the state, we reach the Desh region; also known as Paschim Maharashtra. The Desh region contains Satara, Pune, and Kolhapur. The Desh region was the center of many large kingdoms in Maharashtra, and the royal cuisine heavily influenced the eating habits of the people living in this region. Desh is agriculturally prosperous due to fertile soil and good irrigation. Here, 'Bhakri', an indian flatbread, is eaten with every meal. The Kolhapuri cuisine also incorporates many spicy dishes, and has a large variety of meats like chicken, fish, and mutton. Tambda and Pandhra Rassa are well known Kolhapuri dishes.

To the center of Maharashtra lies the Marathwada region, which encompasses the districts Aurangabad, Beed, Hingoli, Jalna, Latur, Nanded, Osmanabad, and Parbhani. Marathwada produces sugarcane, milk, fruits, and vegetables in abundance as farming and agriculture is the main profession. Popular dishes like Misal, Bhel, Puran poli, and Thalipeeth originate from this region and are now eaten all over Maharashtra.

And finally, at the eastern end of Maharashtra lies Vidarbha. Vidarbha consists of Chandrapur, Gadchiroli, Gondia, Nagpur, Wardha, Akola, Amravati, Buldhana, Yavatmal, Bhandara, and Washim. This region has two cuisines; 'Varhadi' and 'Saoji'. Again, both cuisines include a wide variety of spices. A dish found throughout Vidarbha is 'Gola bhat', which is a rice cooked in turmeric and mustard oil, amongst other spices, and eaten along with dough balls made of chickpea flour.

And here we end our short tour of the delicious cuisines of Maharashtra. Indubitably, Maharashtra is one of the most unique and colourful states of India and I am proud to be a part of it. Happy Maharashtra day!
