1. The syllabus for the M.A Aptitude/ Faculty Change test is as below

Students seeking admission For Regular M.A (hon) Sociology course should follow the FY, SY, TY BA syllabus passed by the Academic council for aptitude/ Faculty test. All core Papers of B.A Sociology will be the syllabus. The syllabus is available on University of Mumbai website under the head Students then Syllabus. Readings are mentioned in the syllabus. The test will of 100 Marks and passing criteria will be 50 per cent of marks and the nature of exam will be subjective (Seven short notes out of which five need to be attempted and each short note will carry 12 Marks, Two descriptive questions which internal Choice and each question will carry 20 marks).

2. The syllabus for M.Phil/PhD Aptitude/ Faculty Change test

Students seeking admission For Regular M.Phil/PhD degree in Sociology course should follow M.A. (Hon) Syllabus passed by the Academic council for aptitude/ Faculty test. All core Papers (SEM-I and Sem-II) of Regular M.A Sociology will be the syllabus. The syllabus is available on University of Mumbai website under the head Students then Syllabus. Readings are mentioned in the syllabus. The test will of 100 Marks and passing criteria will be 50 per cent of marks and the nature of exam will be subjective (Seven short notes out of which five need to be attempted and each short note will carry 12 Marks, Two descriptive questions which internal Choice and each question will carry 20 marks).

Note: Subject to approval from the authority aptitude/faculty change exam may be conducted online with MCQ pattern due to covid-19 situation for this academic year.
