COURSE TITLE: Advanced Chinese I: Reading + Writing

Credits = 04

Course outline:

- 1. Comprehend and apply and make use of advanced language structures in authentic situations. Understand and build complex sentences pertaining to concrete necessities.
- 2. Develop the ability to read and understand complex Chinese characters, idioms and classic Chinese text.
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to read newspaper, magazines, classic poems etc.
- 4. Analyse complex language structures and respond to daily life situations.
- 5. Use language apps and (online) dictionaries.
- 6. Develop the ability to work in different teams and mixed groups.
- 7. Apply language learning skills of reading and writing skills at the advanced level in order to work independently.

Course Outline:

The course shall introduce 1800 basic Chinese words. The focus shall be on practice of reading and listening skills. Emphasis shall be on tone marks and oral comprehension along with rapid listening of Chinese audios.
