New ordinances 6673 & 6674 relating to the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Drama & Theatre)

(i) Necessity of starting

BPA - Bachelor of Performing Arts (Drama and Theatre)

India has witnessed the emergence of various new age courses that are gathering momentum, as students increasingly pursue courses that fuel their passion and open up Job opportunities - A recent demand for educated and qualified professionals was discovered to cater to the flourishing Entertainment industry i.e. the field of performing Arts. Even the world is looking closely at Indian Artists, Actors, Directors, Theatre personalities, Different experiments in Dramas, Films leading to rising employment opportunities for professionals. Further to highlight that due to the extensive presence of the Entertainment industry in Mumbai, it's been considered original Capital for it, making it a preferred destination for professional education in this sector. University of Mumbai by offering structured course for this field shall open up opportunities for multiple aspiring students to pursue their career in this rising Sector.

- (ii) Whether UGC has recommended to start the said Course? The basis to start the course is our indigenous understanding about its requirement and not primarily as per the recommendation from UGC.
- (iii) Whether the course have commenced from the academic year 2019-20? BPA / Bachelor's Degree in performing Arts (Drama/Theatre) course is Planned to start from the academic year 2022-23.
- (iv) The courses started by University are Self Financed, whether adequate number of eligible permanent Faculties are available?

BPA / Bachelor's Degree in Performing Arts (Drama / Theatre) course is planned to start from the academic year 2022-23 and the identification and appointment of Eligible Faculties is under progress.

(v) To give details regarding duration BPA - Bachelor of Performing Arts (Drama and Theatre) course and is it possible to compress the course?

The duration of the course is for Three years which is taken up after considering the optimal duration needed to complete the Syllabus requirement of the course.

(vi) The intake capacity of BPA - Bachelor of Performing Arts (Drama and Theatre) and no. of admissions given in the current Year (2019-20).

The course is to start from the academic year 2022-23 and hence admissions have still not started. The intake of this course is 30 students.

(vii) Opportunities of Employability / Employment available after undertaking BPA - Bachelor of Performing Arts (Drama and Theatre)

The training methodology of the course has a high emphasis on the industry oriented approach. Students are to be part of live projects, internships and other extracurricular activities with the industry during their educational journey to ensure their industry readiness. Along with the collaborations and associations with key industry practitioners, a dedicated placement cell will facilitate different forms of employment opportunities for the students. BPADT 1st Year

BPADT 2nd Year

BPADT 2ND Year is of Two year duration divided in four semesters. Papers taught in this course are Indian Theater, Folk theatre in Maharashtra, Acting (theory and practical), Isms and Classroom production.

After completion of the Diploma, students will be acquainted to Introduction to Regional Stage, History of Theatre and Breathing Techniques.

BPADT 3rd Year

The duration of BPADT 3rd Year is three years with six semesters. It covers information about Indian Theatre, Folk Theatre in Maharashtra, Acting – (theory and practical), Isms and Theatre Production.

It is aimed that student will gain knowledge of Indian Theatre, folk of Maharashtra, techniques of complete acting, studying the acting of famous protagonists, mime & improvisation of skills and ability to make a presentation on the actual theatre.
