Subject: Regarding grant of Autonomous Status to Departments
Institution, Centres and Schools.

CIRCULAR:-

WHEREAS the various education Commissions has recommended that the University Departments, Colleges and teachers should enjoy the full academic freedom in development of curricula, teaching methods and conduct of examination. This recommendation is also reiterated in the National New Education Policy 2020 (NEP-2020)

AND WHEREAS the University of Mumbai had issued Statutes No. 593 to 642 regarding grant of Autonomous Status to Affiliated College/ Recongnised Institution/ University Department/University Institution as passed by the Senate of the University at its special meeting held on 4th December, 2021.

AND WHEREAS in excercise of the power conferred by sub-section (10) of section 72 read with sub-section 71 and section 122 of Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 the Draft Statutes prescribing the norms for grant of autonomy to the University Departments, Institution, Centre and Schools were prepared by the Statutes Committee constituted by the University as per the provisions of Section 72(2) of Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016.

AND WHEREAS the said draft Statutes prepared by the Committee was placed before the Board of Deans at its meeting held on 28th June, 2021 <u>vide</u> item No. 9.23 when the Board of Deans resolved as under:-


"After due discussion & deliberations on the captioned matter, it was resolved that, Grant of Autonomous status and Governance Structure for Autonomous University/Institutuion/Department/Schools/Centre be approved and the same be recommended to Academic Council for consideration and approval."

AND WHEREAS the recommendations made by the Board of Deans was placed before Academic Council at its meeting held on 29th June, 2021 <u>vide</u> item No. 9.23, the Academic Council resolved as under:-

"Considering the resolution passed by the Board of Deans at its meeting held on 28th June, 2021 vide item No. 9.23 it was resolved that for Grant of Autonomous status and Governance structure for Autonomous University/Institution/Department/School/Centre

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(attached herewith) (Annexurel), be accepted and the same be recommended to the Management Council, as per rules."

AND WHEREAS the recommendations and resolution passed by the Board of Deans and Academic Council was placed before the Management Council at its meeting held on 27th September, 2021 <u>vide</u> item no. 14, when the Council resolved as under:-

"It was resolved that the Governing structure for Autonomous University Departments, Centres, Schools and Institutes be accepted and the same be recommended to the Senate ''

AND WHEREAS the recommendations made by the Management Council was placed before the Senate at its meeting held on 15th and 16th March, 2022 <u>vide</u> item No.5 as per the provisions of Section 72(g) of the Maharashtra Public Universites Act, 2016 and the same was accepted by the Senate.

NOW THEREFORE, I Prof. Suhas Pednekar; Vice-Chancellor of the University of Mumbai in exercise of the power conferred upon under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 hereby prescribes norms for grant of Autonomy to University Department/Institution/ Centres and Schools as per enclosed Annexure.

The said norms shall come in to force with immediate effect i.e. the date on which the directions are issued and shall remain operative till such time as Statutes are made in this respect.

[In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (10) of section 72 read with sub-section (7) of section 71 and section 122 of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 (Mah. Act. No. VI of 2017)]

Norms for grant of autonomy to UniversityDepartments /Institutions / Centres / Schools

This shall apply to all University department / institution / centre / schoolof University of Mumbai under the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 seeking the conferment of autonomous status.

- 1. Terms and conditions of an autonomous university department/institution/centre/school-
 - (1) An autonomous university department / institution/centre / schoolshall.
 - (a) review existing courses or programmes and, restructure, redesign and prescribe its own courses or programmes of study and syllabi;
 - (b) formulate new courses or programmes as per the nomenclature specified by the UGC vide Notification No. F.5-1/2013 (CCP-II) published in Gazette of India, July 5, 2014 and as amended from time to time;
 - (c)evolve methods of assessment of students performance, conduct of examinations and declaration of results;
 - (d) announce results, issue mark sheets and other certificates, with University logo. However, the degree

shall be awarded by the University with the name of the university department / institution / centre / schoolon the degree certificate;

- (e)prescribe norms for admission which shall be in consonance with the reservation policy of the State Government or Central Government, as the case may be;
- (f) prepare Academic Calendar which shall be in consonance with the University calendar;
- (g) strengthen research activities;
- (h) recommend fees for the respective courses for consideration of Fee Fixation Committee of the University;
- (i) constitute its own Admission Committee,
 Departmental Committee, Examination Committee,
 Board of Studies, Research Advisory Committee and
 other Committees for smooth conduct of academic
 programmes and examination.
- (2) Autonomous university department / institution/centre / schoolshall have full academic and administrative autonomy. However, it will not have a privilege of creating and appointing its own administrative and teaching posts. Teachers shall be appointed by the university as per the University Grants Commission (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers

- and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2010 or AICTE or other Regulatory Bodies as amended from time to time;
- (3) The autonomous university department /
 institution/centre / schoolshall continue to receive only
 those funds from university, State Government, Central
 Government and other funding agencies as being done
 before the grant of autonomous status, if any:
 - Provided that, the autonomous *university department / institution/centre /school*does not entitle for any extra grants after conferment of autonomous status.
- (4) Autonomy granted to the *university department* / institution/centre/schoolis at the institutional level and is not partial, and shall cover the programmes at all levels such as U.G., and P.G., offered by the *university department* / institution/centre / school. The courses introduced by the *university department* / institution/centre / schoolafter the conferment of autonomous status shall automatically come under the purview of autonomy.
 - Ph.D. will be governed by University rules and regulations.
- (5) The autonomy shall always come into effect from the ensuing academic year.

- (6) The students enrolled for the first year of any course at the time of actual commencement of autonomy to the university department or university school or university institution only shall be covered under autonomy and thereafter such students shall be covered under autonomy progressively.
- (7) Autonomous status shall be granted to *university* department / institution/centre and schoolinitially for a period of five years. Every further extension for five years shall be granted after receiving and reviewing the satisfactory report of the Expert Committee, appointed by the Vice-Chancellor of the university.

2. Role of the University.-

- (1) The Board of Deans of the University shall, after receiving the application of the university department / institution/centre/schoolfor grant of autonomous status, constitute the Expert Committee for onsite visit to the university department / institution/centre school. The Expert Committee shall consist of the following members, namely:-
- (a) Former Vice-Chancellor of the State university or Central university in IndiaChairman
- (b) Dean of the Faculty concerned of other university in India;
- (c) Two professors in the relevant subject, of other

universities;

- (d) Director Higher Education or his nominee not below the rank of Joint Director.
- (e) Dean of the faculty concerned..... Member Secretary.
- (2) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolon attaining autonomous status shall continue to be university department / institution/centre/ schooland shall enjoy the privileges of autonomy.
- (3) The university shall ensure that all teaching positions required to run self-financed courses are also filled.
- (4) There shall be responsive administrative and governance support of the university.
- 3. Eligibility.-
- (1) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolshall have at least 10 years of existence.
- (2) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolshall have the required number of qualified full-time teachers appointed as per norms.
- (3) The university department / institution/centre/ schooloffering technical programmes shall be accredited by NBA for three years.
- (4) Management and Academic Council may relax one or two eligibility conditions / criteria for conferment or extension of autonomous status.

- 4. Conferment or extension of autonomous status.-
- (1) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolintending to have autonomous status shall submit an application to the university, any time during the year, in the Form annexed to this Statute.
- (2) If the *university department / institution/centre/ school* is found to have fulfilled the eligibility conditions, the Board of Deans, shall examine the proposal for conferment or extension of autonomous status and shall arrange for onsite visit of an Expert Committee.
- (3) The report of the Expert Committee for conferment or extension of autonomous status shall be placed before Academic Council and Management Council by the Board of Deans for consideration. The letter granting autonomy may be issued by the university on the basis of the decision of the Management Council.
- (4) The autonomous *university department / institution/centre/ school* shall apply in the prescribed Form to the university
 for extension of autonomous status six months prior to
 expiry of the autonomy cycle.
- (5) If an autonomous *university department / institution/centre/*school wishes to surrender the autonomous status, it shall follow due process of forwarding the resolution passed by

- the Executive Body to the university. However, such withdrawal shall take effect only after the last batch of students then enrolled under autonomy passes out.
- 5. Criteria for granting autonomy to the university department / institution/centre/ school-
- (1) Good academic reputation with previous performance in university examinations and its academic or co-curricular or extension or research activities.
- (2) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolshall have executed at least five Projects sanctioned by the Government or non- Government Funding Agencies in preceding five years.
- (3) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolshall have been conducted faculty training programmes, such as FDP, STTP, etc.
- (4) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolshall have been sanctioned Institutional Development Proposals such as FIST by DST, SAP by UGC, MODROB by AICTE, ICSSR, YASHADA, SWACH BHARAT, JALYUKT SHIWAR, UNNAT BHARAT, etc.
- (5) The university department / institution/centre/ schoolshall have been strong linkages with Industries or Society or Alumni and shall have record of resource generation through consultancy.
- (6) The university department / institution/centre/ school shall have

- good placement record (in campus and off campus), for preceding five years.
- (7) The examination result of the *university department* / institution/centre/ schoolshall be 75% average for preceding five years.
- (8) Extension Activities of the university department / institution/centre/ schoolshowing connectivity with the society.
- (9) Quality and merit in the selection of UG, PG, and Ph.D. students subject to statutory requirements in this regard.
- (10) Adequacy of infrastructure in terms of class rooms, library, books, journals and e-resources, laboratories and equipment, sports facilities and facilities for recreation activities for faculty and students as per the norms and standards.
- (11) Financial strength of the university department / institution/centre/ schoolin the form of adequate budgetary provisions annually by the University.
- (12) Motivation and involvement of faculty in the promotion of innovative reforms.

- 6. Monitoring of Autonomous university department / institution/centre/school-
 - (1) The Departmental Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) shall have been established in the *university* department / institution/centre/ schoolfor regular monitoring of the activities. The Departmental IQAC shall consist of the following members, namely:-
 - (a) Head/ Director of Universityuniversitydepartment / institution/centre/school Chairman;
 - (b) External Expert from Industry or Research

 Organization or Academic Institution nominated by

 Vice-Chancellor.... Member
 - (c) One Professor, One Associate Professor, One Assistant Professor nominated by the Director/ Head of the university department, university school or university institution.... Member
 - (d) Student Representative, one under-graduate or postgraduate and one Ph. D..... Member
 - (e) Representative of administration of university

 department / institution/centre/school
 - (f) One Alumni of the university department / institution/centre/school.... Member
 - (g) One Teacher nominated by the Head/ Director of the university department / institution/centre/ school....
 Member Secretary.

- (2) The Departmental IQAC shall appoint an external Peer Team comprising of academicians of repute and shall send report to university regarding the performance of the university department / institution/centre/school.
- (3) The report shall also be put on public domain on the website of the *university department / institution/centre/ school*. The external peer review shall be conducted at least once in a year. On receipt of adverse report by the external peer team appointed by Departmental IQAC or in case of complaint, the university shall have powers to constitute its own Expert Committee for careful scrutiny of the report and may revoke the autonomous status of the *university department / institution/centre/ school* after giving due opportunity to the *university department / institution/centre/ school* to defend itself.
- (4) The autonomous university department / institution/centre/ shall, without fail, upload on its website school information regarding the courses offered by it, fees for the courses, details of the teachers along with qualification and unique ID, details of adjunct teachers, admission procedure, the details of relevant infrastructures, research activities of the university department / institution/centre/ schoolincluding thrust areas of research along with the details of Ph.D. students enrolled, with the date of registrations, topics of research, name of

- the supervisor, etc.
- (5) The university department / institution/centre/ school shall also put on its website the creation of various Committees or Cells as mandated in the various University Regulations notified from time to time. The university department / institution / centre / school shall conduct the meetings of the statutory bodies regularly and upload the minutes of the meetings on the website of the university department / institution / centre / school.
- (6) The university department / institution / centre / school shall upload on its website all the information about the university department / institution / centre / school in the prescribed format and the same shall be sent to the university while applying for fresh or extension of autonomous status. The university department / institution / centre / schoolshall also submit progress report the university and utilization certificate annually to the university and other funding agencies as per the prescribed norms.
- (7) All the Regulations notified by the university, UGC and State Government shall be followed in letter and spirit by all the Autonomous *university department / institution / centre / school*and an undertaking to this effect shall be uploaded on the department website.

- 7. Matters regarding starting of new courses.-
- (1) An autonomous university department / institution / centre / schoolis free to start diploma courses of the level of undergraduate or post-graduate or certificate course without prior approval of the University and State Government:

 Provided that, the prior approval of the Executive Body shall be obtained before introduction of these courses.

 Diplomas and certificates shall be issued under the seal of the university department / institution / centre / school. The university shall, however, be informed about such introduction of new courses.
- (2) An autonomous university department / institution / centre / school is free to start a new degree or post-graduate course or Ph.D. with the prior approval of the Academic Council of the university and concerned Statutory Councils, such as AICTE, NCTE, PCI, BCI etc., wherever required, provided the nomenclature of the degree is asper the University Grants Commission Notification on Specification of Degrees, 2014 and as amended from time to time. Such courses shall fulfill the minimum standards prescribed by the university or University Grants Commission in terms of number of hours, credits,

- curricular content and standards.
- (3) An autonomous university department / institution / centre / schoolmay rename an existing course as per the University Grants Commission Notification on Specification of Degrees issued under section 22 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 as amended from time to time, after restructuring or redesigning it with the prior approval of the Academic Council of the university.
- 8. Governance of an autonomous university department / institution / centre / school-
- (1) The university department / institution / centre / school shall constitute various bodies and committees to ensure proper management of academic, financial and general administrative affairs. The statutory bodies in the autonomous university department / institution / centre / schoolshall be as under:-
 - (a) Governing Council
 - (b) Executive Body;
 - (c) Departmental Committee;
 - (d) Board of Studies.
- (2) The university department / institution / centre / schoolshall, in addition, have other non-statutory committees such as the Planning and Evaluation Committee, Finance Committee, Purchase Committee, Grievance Redressal Committee, Examination Committee, Admission Committee,

Research committee, Library Committee, Student
Welfare Committee, Internal Complaint Committee,
Unfair Means Inquiry Committee, Anti Ragging
Committee, Extra-Curricular Activities Committee and
Academic Audit Committee, etc.

(3) Governing Council

- (a) The Governing Council shall consist of the following members, namely:-
- Vice Chancellor......Chairman
- Pro Vice Chancellor,
- one MC member to be nominated by VC,
- one university professor and one principal to be nominated by VC,
- two experienced professional to be nominated by State Government,
- one eminent Industrialist/ Academician/Scientist to be nominated by VC
- Registrar ,
- Director / Head of the university department / institution / centre / schoolas member secretary
- b) The Governing Council shall have the following powers and duties, namely:-
 - (i) To envision and finalize the academic, research, outreach policies of the Centre/ Department/ Institution/ School
 - (ii) To discuss and approve the recommendations of

- Executive Body and devise guiding parameters for working of Executive Body
- (iii)to provide infrastructural facility for innovation and research project.
- (*iv*) to recommend to the university the required faculty and non-teaching staff for appointment.
- (v) to recommend to the university for signing of MoU with industry or research or academic institutions.
 - Term of Governing Council will be for 3 years.
 - The Governing Councilshall meet at least twice a year.
 - Two third members will form the quorum.

(4) Executive Body

- (a) The Executive Body shall consist of the following members, namely:-
- (i) Pro-Vice-ChancellorChairman;
- (ii) Dean of Faculty concerned;
- (iii)Director/ Head of the university department / institution / centre / school;
- (iv) expert from Industry or Research Organization nominated by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (v) two Professors from other Universities or autonomousInstitutes nominated by the Vice- Chancellor;
- (vi) one Professor, one Associated Professor, one Assistant Professor, from the university department / institution / centre / schoolnominated by Head of the

Department;

- (vii) Chairman of Board of Studies of the relevant subject of the University;
- (viii) one senior teacher nominated by Head of Department....Member Secretary.
- b) The Executive Body shall have the following powers and duties, namely:-
 - (i) to recommend new under-graduate and postgraduate courses to the Academic Council of the University.
- (ii) to control, regulate and co-ordinate research activity to maintain standards of teaching and research.
- (iii) to approve academic calendar of the department, curriculum of the courses, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, departmental extension activities,
- iv) to recommend departmental budget to the university to incorporate in the university budget.
 - (vi) to allocate funds generated by the autonomous university department / institution / centre / schoolby undertaking projects as per the norms of the funding agency.
 - (vii) to provide guidelines for distribution of share generated through consultancy and allied services, among the teachers providing consultancy and allied services, autonomous university department / institution / centre / schooland the university.

- (viii) to approve departmental research proposals for submission to funding agency through university.
- (ix) to approve Alumni association.
- (x) to recommend to the university institution of scholarship, studentship, fellowship, prizes and medals.
- (xi) to perform such other functions as may be assigned by the university and governing Council.
- (xii) to approve regulations regarding admission of students to different programme of study in the department.
- (xiii)to approve regulations for sports, extra-curricular activities and proper maintenance and functioning of equipment and facilities.
- (b) Term of the Executive Body shall be three years.
- (c) The Executive Body shall meet at least six times a year. Skipping/ remaining absent for three meetings in succession will lead to termination of membership.
- (d) Two third members will form the quorum
 - (5) Departmental Committee.-
- (a) the Departmental Committee of university institution shall consist of the following members, namely:-
- (i) the Director or Head of Institution/ School/ Depaartment/CentreChairman;
- (ii) all the Heads of Departments in the university institution;
- (iii)two Professors in the university institution;
- (iv) two Associate Professors in the university institution;

- (v) three Assistant Professors in the university institution:
 Provided that the teachers representing different categories of teaching staff be appointed by the Director by rotation on the basis of seniority of service in the university institution;
- (vi) not less than three experts or academicians from outside the university representing various fields to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (vii) a teacher in the university institution nominated by the Director...... Member Secretary.
- (b) the Departmental Committee of university department shall consist of the following members, namely:-
- (ii) all the Professors of the department;
- (iii)two Associate Professors of the department;
- (iv) two Assistant Professors of the department;
 - Provided that the teachers representing different categories of teaching staff be appointed by the Head by rotation on the basis of seniority of service in the department.
- (v) not less than three experts or academicians from outside the university representing various fields to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (vi) a teacher nominated by the Head of the university

- departmentMember Secretary.
- Note: The Eminent visiting faculty members/ Professors can be invited on the statutory bodies.
- (c) The term of nominated members of the Departmental Committee shall be three years.
- (d) The Departmental Committee shall meet at least twice a year.
- (e) Powers and Functions of the Departmental Committee: The Departmental Committee of the university department / institution / centre / schoolshall have following powers and functions, namely:-
 - (i) to guide the University universitydepartment / institution / centre / schoolwhile fulfilling the objectives for which the university universitydepartment / institution / centre / school has been granted autonomous status;
- (ii) to recommend to the ExecutiveBody for approval of new programmesof study leading to degrees or diplomas;
- (iii) to make efforts for recruitments of teaching faculty in accordance with the policies laid down by the university and State Government, from time to time;
- (iv) to prepare and submit annual budget of the university department/institution/centre/schoolto the Executive body;
- (v) to perform such other functions and institute committees, as may be necessary and deemed fit for the proper development of the university department / institution / centre /

school;

- (vi) to scrutinize and approve the proposals, with or without modification, of the Boards of Studies with regard to courses of study, academic regulations, curricula, syllabi and modifications thereof, instructional and evaluation arrangements, methods, procedures relevant thereto etc., provided that, where the Academic Council of the university differs on any proposal, it shall have the right to refer back the matter for reconsideration through the head of the university department / institution / centre / schoolto the Board of Studies concerned or reject it, after giving reasons to do so.
- (vii) to make draft regulations regarding the admission of students to different programmes of study in the university department / institution / centre / schoolkeeping in view the policy of the Government.
- (viii) to make draft regulations for sports, extra-curricular activities, and proper maintenance and functioning of equipment and facilities,
- (ix) to recommend to the Executive Body, institution of scholarships, studentships, fellowships, prizes and medals, and to frame regulations for the award of the same.
- (x) to give suggestions(s) to the university pertaining to academic affairs made by it.

(xi) to perform such other functions as may be assigned by the university.

(6) Board of Studies.-

- (a) the Board of Studies shall consist of the following members, namely:-
 - (i) head of the university department or Director of the university institutionChairman;
 - (ii) one teacher of each specialization;
 - (iii) Two subject experts from outside the university to be nominated by the Chairman of the Executive Body;
 - (iv) one expert to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor from a panel of six recommended by Head of the university department or Director of the university institution/centre/school;
 - (v) One representative from industry or corporate sector or allied area relating to placement nominated by the Executive Body
 - (vi) one post-graduate meritorious alumnus to be nominated by Director of the Institution or Head of the Department;
 - (vii) the Chairman, Board of Studies, may co-opt:
 - (a) Experts from outside the university whenever special courses of studies are to be formulated;
 - (b) Other member of staff of the same faculty;
 - (c) One teacher to be nominated by the Head of the

- university department or Director of the university institution...... Member Secretary.
- (b) The term of the nominated members of the Board of Studies shall be three years.
- (c) The Board of Studies shall meet at least twice a year.
- (d) Two third members will form the quorum.
- (e) The Board of Studies of university department / institution / centre / schoolshall have the following powers and functions, namely:-
 - (i) to prepare syllabi for various courses keeping in view the objectives of the college, interest of the stakeholders and national requirement for consideration and forward to the Academic Council of the university for approval;
 - (ii) to suggest methodologies for innovative teaching and evaluation techniques;
 - (iii) to suggest panel of teachers to the Executive Body for appointment of examiners, paper setters and evaluators.
 - (iv) to coordinate research, teaching, extension and other academic activities in the *university department* / institution / centre / school.
- (b) Examination cell and system:

An autonomous *university department / institution / centre / school*shall have an examination section headed by the

Chairman of Examination Committee. The head of the department or director of the university school shall be the chief controller of examinations. The chairman of examination committee shall be assisted by the deputy chairman of the examination committee along with other office support.

- (7) ExaminationCommittee.-
- (a) the examination committee shall consist of the following members, namely:-
- (ii) one Professor nominated by the Head of the university department or Director of the university institution;
- (iii) one Associate Professor nominated by the Head of the university department or Director of the university institution;
- (iv)two Assistant Professors nominated by the Head of the university department or Director of the university institution;
- (v) two administrative staff nominated by the Head of the university department or Director of the university institution;
- (vi)one teacher nominated by the Head of the university department or Director of the university institution

.....Member Secretary.

- (b) Term of the Examination Committee shall be three years.
- (c) The Examination Committee shall meet at least twice a year.
- (d) The Examination Committee shall have the following functions, namely:-
- (i) to prepare time tables for Internal and end-semester examinations;
- (ii) conduct of examinations;
