 University, Jalgaon and Bhonsala Military College, Nashik. Though,University of Mumbai has affiliated college known as Naval War College which meant only forservice staff from Indian
 Navy. In nutshell, there is scope for University of Mumbai to fill in
 thisvacuumandexplorepossibilitiestosetupnewDepartmentofInternationalandStrategicStudies.
- Mumbai being International City and Financial Capital of India, after Delhi Mumbai City hasmaximum foreign offices either Diplomatic or International Trade related Staffs who arestationed in their offices like Consular-Generals and Deputy High Commissions in vicinity. So,UniversityMumbaihasdirectaccesstothisdiplomaticcommunitytoimparttheirandsharetheirexpe riencesand knowledgeof their international relations.
- International Relations and Strategic Studies, this subject is one of the vital components of various professional courses as well as career-oriented examinations either by Union PublicService Commission/ MPSC/ Staff Selection Board. In Maharashtra we don't have institutes ororganizations which can provide the professional training or any mechanism to make them, (especially, aspirantcivilservants) to understand the basic concepts and theories of International Relations/ Studies as well as strategic thoughts from the defense perspective. In absence of this kind of institutions many young scholars from Mumbai and nearby cities almost 80 percent of them chose New Delhi as destination or for research they look for admission in foreignuniversities.

- a) In this Masters programmed they intend to study in depth the knowledge of the different social, cultural, political and economic is sues of other nations from Indian perspective to corelate India's polity, socio-economic conditions and cultural ethos with other nations.

This wouldhelp them to understand the nature of counter-strikes and to know that how countries protectthemselvesand howworld politics influencespolicy measures forthe security of anation.
- d) Mumbai being HQ of Western Naval Command of Indian Navy and Pune being HQ of SouthernCommandofIndianArmyotherInstitutionsofNDA,CMEandAFMCtheassociationwiththes einstitutionsmay help to inculcate thesenseofnationalism and nationhood.
