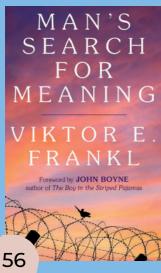

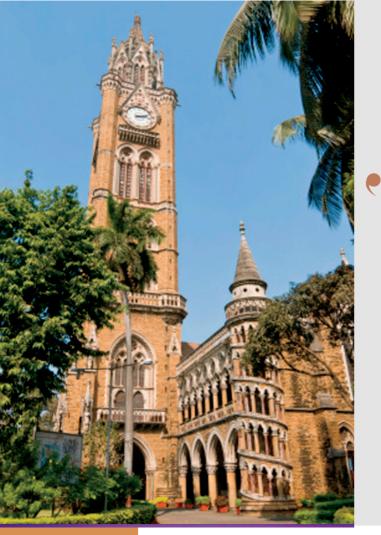

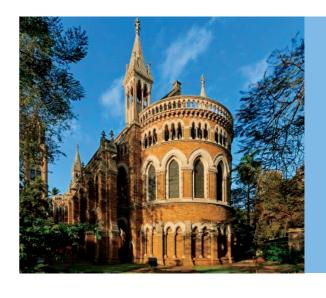

About us

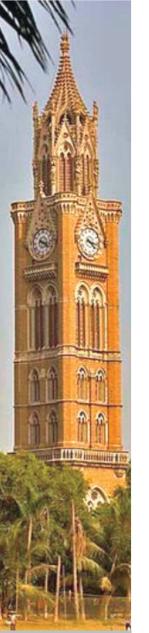

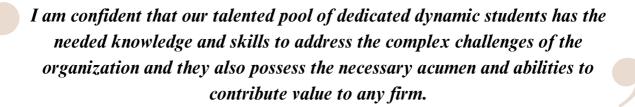
The curriculum has been designed in response to the need of the industry and to equip the students with an excellent blend of

As a faculty of department, I found this batch of 2022-23 to be sincere, focused and enthusiastic towards their career.

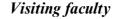

Presentations

Organisational Development (OD)

As a part of the OD curriculum, the I/O students presented various topics that are essential to understand the whole of OD. The presentations gave the students an opportunity to learn and understand how to inculcate accurate research, provide the correct information and provide real time examples of the various topics of OD. They helped us understand the current trends in OD, the history of various OD practices, system interventions, training experiences of various OD interventions, how cultural analysis is done with the help of OD models, and the emerging issues with their potential solutions for OD. The crux behind these student presentations was to better conceptualize for the students the true purpose of OD, which is to enable an organization to better respond and adapt to organizational changes and technological advances.





Human Resource Management (HRM) & Competency Assessment

HRM is the effective and efficient handling of employees, and nurturing and supporting them in a way that promotes a positive workplace environment, as well as ensures competitive advantage to the business. As a part of class presentations, the students went beyond the boundaries of the syllabus. and presented topics relating to the intersection of HR practices with technology, such as: HR Balance Scorecard, HRIS, HR Analytics, Artificial intelligence & HR, and Employee Assistance Programs.

Similarly, as a way to understand the different competencies to be measured for assessment, students selected various competency groupings or theories to present that were informative yet fun and interactive. They included a diverse range of competencies such as: Interpersonal Understanding, Problem Solving, Communication, Handling Pressure, Sportsmanship, etc.

Open Sesame and Experiment Designing

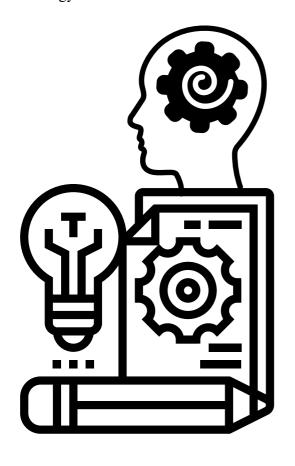
The students were divided into 7 groups where each of them was required to present their chosen topics and 1 student out of each group was selected for the final experiment. Experiments were based on various cognitive and behavioral elements that have been studied in depth through psychology. The development process was monitored by the respective faculty members and they guided the students at every stage. The experiments were then administered to people, and the results were then analyzed to confirm or discard the hypotheses.

Open sesame was predominantly used by the students when developing these experiments. "Open Sesame" is a software widely used for the development of experiments in psychology, neuroscience, and various behavioral sciences. These experiments were highly creative and had sound theoretical backing. The students not only gained first-hand experience in designing an experiment from scratch but also became well-equipped with the use of technology in research.

R and Scale Development

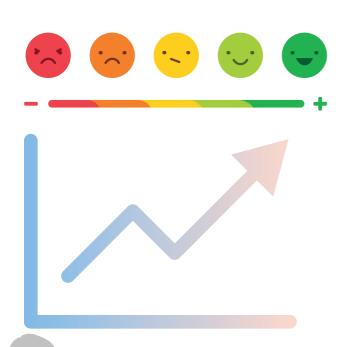
R is a free software environment for statistical computing and graphics. It uses its own programming language and a wide range of built-in functions in handling mathematical and statistical data.

The students were familiarized with the software through lectures and assignments and were expected to develop a scale. They were divided into groups for the same and each group worked together with their respective guides to develop a scale from scratch.

They followed all guidelines from making an item pool, getting it reviewed by experts, conducting a pilot test, and finally standardizing the test and developing norms.

Using the software gave the students a more accurate way of carrying out the statistical analysis as using the software can be faster and reduces human errors. The software was a new and technologically advanced approach to statistics and the students were able to acquire useful skills along with technological competence.

Structured Activities

Structured Activities, now common in the field of I/O, cater to the unique 'experiential' learning style of adults. The ability to try on new behaviours and emotions makes it fully beneficial to students. A structured experience provides a framework in which the inductive process can be facilitated; and the participants discover meaning for themselves as well as validate their own learning.

One of the objectives of structured activities is the development, practise, and application of interpersonal skills and techniques. Structured activities are employed to work on interpersonal as well as intergroup communication, problem solving, and other multiple constructs.

Because the activities are typically done in groups, the best starts are with ice-breaker activities that allow participants to open up to their group members, interact freely with one another, and become more comfortable sharing, talking, and expressing their thoughts. Following this guideline, the students of UDAP participated in two icebreaker activities - Who Am I? and Tree of Life, before moving on to activities like Human Values Continuum, Ring Toss Experiment, and Desert Survival. The tryst ended with the students participating in a four hour workshop of numerous activities conducted by alumna and resource person Ms. Tejal Shah.

The aim of the structured activities conducted in Semester-3 was similar to allowing students to engage, experience, and gain





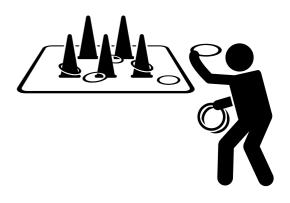












Who am I?

<u>Aim</u>: To get the students acquainted with each other on the first day of the semester.

In addition to being the first structured activity, it was also an introduction to how workshop activities are to be conducted. In this activity, the students were asked to write down answers to questions about themselves on a piece of paper and pin it on themselves. Following this, they were asked to walk around the class and interact with others and ask questions related to the answers in to get to know more about each other. The initial sense of awkwardness gradually faded away with each interaction, and students could be seen freely mingling with each other.

This activity enabled students to get a more precise understanding of icebreakers and the way they are conducted among a group of people.





Tree of Life







<u>Aim</u>: To get the students to talk about those aspects of life they normally won't converse about

The second activity, besides being meaningful, also enabled the students to bring out their creative potential while making a model of the tree and getting acquainted with each other through the different versions and interpretations of the tree. Each part of the tree denoted something about their lives and complete creative freedom was given for the presentation of the tree.

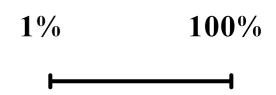
The objective of this activity was to provide the students with an environment where they can be open and honest with their 0classmates and share their failures, strengths, and weaknesses in a non-threatening way as well as to get inspired by one another as they get to learn about each other. Aspects of introspection, self-reflection, and accepting individual differences were also at play in this activity.

Human Values Continuum

<u>Aim</u>: To get the students physically involved in thinking about their value statement responses and discuss them.

The activity was based on the cultures and values of an individual, as given by Hofstede's cultural variables. Two statements were given to the students at a given time and they had to choose to what percent they agree with a given statement and also give reasons for it, following this they were asked to place themselves on the continuum.

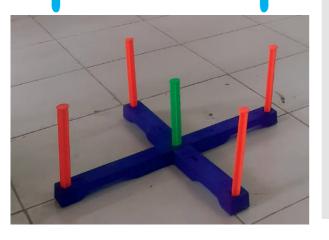
The goal was met as the students engaged in critical thinking and reflecting on the value statements. Overall, this was a very engaging activity and put forth a lot of distinct ideas and opened up a new way of thinking for the students.





Ring Toss Experiment

GOAL!



<u>Aim</u>: To enable students to engage and examine their risk-taking behaviors as well as their achievement motivation through goal-setting behavior.

This activity allowed the students to explore the extent to which they are aware of the information generated by them and use it readily to modify their behavior as well as take personal responsibility in accomplishing certain tasks. Students had to have 2 successful throws of the ring into the peg, and the freedom of which distance to use to gain maximum points was up to them.

The activity provided great exposure to the topics of risk-taking and decision-making, but in a fun playful way which helped the students get firsthand experience of these concepts.

Desert Survival

Aim: To enable consensus group decision making.

The basis of the activity was that each group was given 15 items that would be used if they were stuck in a desert, which had to be ranked individually and in a group setting. There are three types of skills that were used in decision-making such as problem-solving skills, task facilitation skills, and group-building processes.

This activity helped the students understand the power of interactions among teammates to reach conclusions and solve problems. The consensus was heavily at play in this activity as the entire activity comes down to how the groups reach a common consensus through discussions and if necessary even debates which also helps in team building.



Team Building Workshop





<u>Aim</u>: To promote team-building; To aid students build their own workshops

Dr. Tejal Shah, an alumni, conducted a workshop on team-building. Team building is the process of teaching people to collaborate and perform as a team; it has grown in significance in today's corporate environment since it promotes relationships and builds trust among co-workers. Complex games and activities are typically emphasized when the phrase "team building" is used.

She guided us through many structured experience exercises that are frequently carried out in a corporate setting for a number of reasons. The workshop included a number of teambuilding activities, all of had a fun and motivational approach. As a student, we were made to research the specific topic which was allotted to us and come up with a different practical way of presenting the theories of that particular topic. The process includes the initial research which then was shared with the faculty mentor which was assigned to each group, this helped us in making our workshop more refined. Looking Within and Beyond By: Mrunal, Nimisha, Janhavi

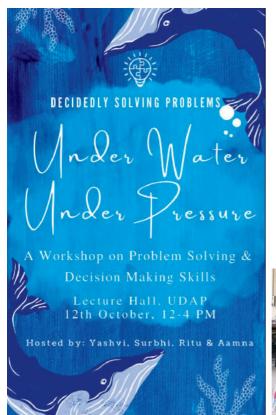

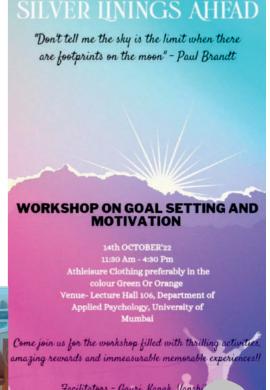

Goals are purposeful actions that are carried out after careful consideration, as opposed to wants or intentions and it demonstrates a person's commitment to achieving them through thought, behavior, and emotion. Motivation works as a driving force for us to engage in goal-directed behavior and can be conscious or unconscious in humans.

Theories such as SMART goal-setting approach, self-efficacy theory of Albert Bandura, The goal-setting theory developed by Locke and Latham, and The notion of operant conditioning introduced by B.F. Skinner was used to back up the practical activities.

Communication Skills & Conflict Management

Jab Koi Baat Bigad Jaaye....Talk It Through By: Manasi, Vishal, Sakshi

Communication is the act of passing information from one to another - carried out verbally, in writing, visually, nonverbally, etc. It's important to have this ability to build connections, interact effectively, cooperate, and resolve conflicts, among other things. Conflict management is the ability to recognize disputes and resolve them in a reasonable, equitable, and effective way. Simple differences of opinion can rapidly escalate into resentment or worse due to poor communication or interpersonal strain. Professionals should strive to resolve conflict effectively rather than trying to avoid it at work.

There were a total of seven activities with unique names such as Yeh Santra Mujhe De De Thakur, Aakhir Kehna Kya Chahte Ho??, Tum Saath Ho Ya Na Ho, Kya Tha Who Ab Guess Karo.

The theme of the workshop was "Bollywood", and participants were encouraged to dress up as their favourite movie characters to make the experience more fun and memorable. The decor and activity names were kept in-line with the theme.













HRD INSTRUMENTS



Human resource development instruments are used by organizations to help employees, hone their existing capabilities in addition to developing new ones. Being industrial psychology students, we were given exposure to certain HRD instruments as part of our curriculum to gain insight into how the forms are filled out by the employees and what we can find out from particular instruments.



Team Orientation & Behavior Inventory (TOBI)

The TOBI assessment is based on a self-report questionnaire that asks participants to rate their own behavior and the behavior of their team members in various team-related situations. TOBI generates 4 distinct scores. Scores can be matched with 4 profiles that TOBI gives.

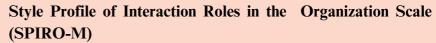
HRD Climate Survey

Developed by T.V. Rao and E. Abraham, it consists of 38 items. It covers 7 dimensions of organizational climate:

- 1. Positive developmental climate
- 2. Top management commitment
- 3. Employee nurturance
- 4. Employee trainability
- 5. Reward administration
- 6. Mutuality and trust
- 7. Progression

Role Efficacy Scale

In a structured test consisting of 20 triads of statements. The scale measures 10 dimensions, covering the elements of role making, role centering and role linkage.



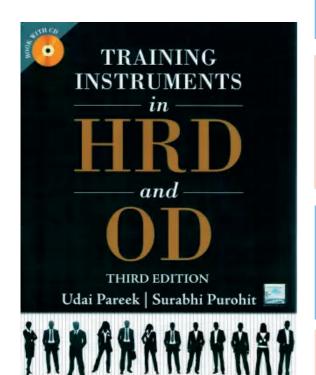
The test contains 36 statements that the respondent has to rate on a 5 point scale. The test can be used by managers, trainers, consultants, or coaches to determine their managerial style. SPIRO-M is specifically for managers.

Motivational Analysis of Organizational Behavior (MAO-B)

The MAO-B instrument was developed by Udai Pareek. iIt consists 60 items and measures 6 dimensions, namely, Achievement, Influence, Control, Dependence, Extension & Affiliation Motives.

Role Stress Scale

This scale was designed by Udai Pareek, has 50 items & measures the 10 dimensions of organizational role stress, some of which are inter-role distance, role stagnation, , role erosion, personal inadequacy, role ambiguity, etc.



FORCE FIELD ANALYSIS

Force Field Analysis (FFA) is a widely-used change management model. It is a basic tool for root cause analysis that can help to take action once the root cause has been identified. This approach is predicated on the idea that any condition results from an equilibrium between forces for and against the current state. They are called driving forces and restraining forces, respectively.



Steps for force field analysis:

- 1. Determining the current problematic stage.
- 2. Deciding the future desired condition.
- 3. Identifying the forces and factors operating in current conditions.
- 4. Examine the strength of the driving and restraining forces.
- 5. Construct strategies or action plans to stabilize equilibrium at the desired condition.
- 6. Determine the priority levels or initiation sequence of all action plans.
- 7. Implement action plans.

FFA was conducted within the Department of Applied Psychology, University of Mumbai. For this process, the class was divided into 2 teams, each team consisting of one head and one co-head. The heads and co-heads of both teams collectively decided on a common goal for the Department of Applied Psychology to be achieved by a certain deadline. After the division of teams, each team discussed within them the required categories to study and analyze for the goal accomplishment.

Several team meetings were conducted and the driving & restraining forces were listed down for each category. Both teams had listed several similar as well as several differing forces. After listing down the driving and restraining forces in each category, all the team members gave their individual ratings to each of the forces in each category that their respective team discussed and created.

Ratings were given on a 5-point rating scale where the driving forces were rated based on how helpful they are- 1 representing not very helpful and 5 representing very helpful. The restraining forces were rated based on what needs immediate action on a scale of 1 to 5, 1 being doesn't need immediate action and 5 being needs immediate action. Once all the team members of both teams finished the individual ratings, both team leaders coordinated and discussed the categories and list of forces created by each team. Based on the discussion, several categories and forces were added, eliminated and modified. A final list of forces was created and then both team members gave individual ratings to the modified list. Later, an average was calculated for each of the forces based on the ratings given. Another discussion was conducted with the entire class and action plans were decided based on the average ratings.

Focus Group Discussions

A Focus Group Discussion (FGD) is a qualitative research & data collection method where a selected group of individuals discuss a certain topic or issue in-depth, assisted by a skilled moderator. Facilitation is a key component of FGD. This technique is used to elicit the participants' attitudes, knowledge, behaviors, experiences & perspectives.

FGDs can be used to investigate the diversity of viewpoints on a subject of interest. They can be particularly helpful in bridging research and policy by giving an insight into the various viewpoints among the many stakeholders participating in the change process, allowing the process to be guided more effectively.

Organizational development (OD) programs can benefit greatly from FGDs. Group or organizational issues can be resolved more effectively with the assistance of a well-designed FGD. They may be employed at any time during the course of a project or program. For example, they can be used to provide ongoing feedback during project implementation or at the design or planning stages to assisting in shaping the project. They are particularly useful when a lot of qualitative information needs to be collected in a short period.

Group 1: E-Commerce

The students explored how community bazaars & local markets are influenced by e-commerce, as well as the precautions that regular online shoppers take.

Group 2: Changing the Field of Study in India

Students aimed to understand the driving & restraining forces that influence the decision of changing the field of study in India.

Group 3: Employee View on Therapy at Workplace

The students attempted to understand the views of employees about EAP/ counselling services at their workplace.



Group 4: Misrepresentation of Women & LGBTQIA community in Media

The students wanted to reflect on how media ideologies & narratives have portrayed minority characters by dividing truth from fiction.

Appreciative Inquiry

Appreciative inquiry is a model of change with a strength-based approach. It seeks to help individuals and organizations recognize their strengths and build on them to achieve their vision. David Cooperrider and Suresh Srivastava championed the model. Appreciative inquiry is unique as it moves away from the disease model, instead focusing on the assets the individual or organization possesses and can develop rather than on the weaknesses. It can be used at various levels: individual, group, organizational, or even social. Today, it is frequently used in organizations to bring innovation by making strategic plans, strengthening their core values, improving their organizational culture, etc. Additionally, its unique approach shows faith in human potential, fosters collaboration, and builds connections among individuals.

Appreciative Inquiry follows a 4D cycle, namely:

Discover, "What is?", wherein the strengths and assets of the participant are realized.

Dream, "What might be?", participants envision a future they desire.

Design, "What should be?", strengths & dreams are collated to find the ideal.

Destiny, "What will be?", strategies to achieve the ideal are implemented.

Appreciative Inquiry also has 5 principles:

Constructionist Principle:

"Words create Worlds"

Simultaneity Principle:

"Inquiry creates Change"

Poetic Principle:

"We can Choose What we Study"

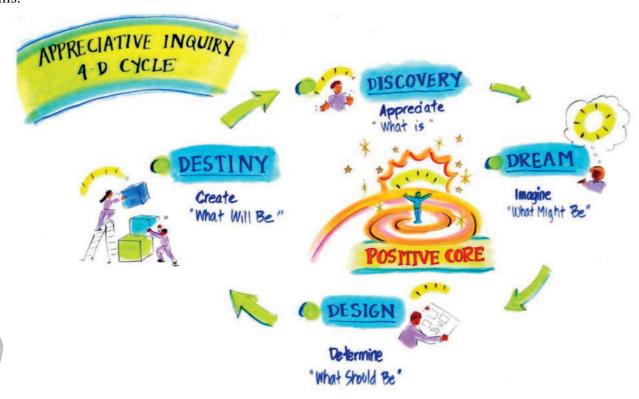
Anticipatory Principle:

"Images Inspire Action"

Positive Principle:

"Positive Questions Lead to Positive Change"

Appreciative Inquiry was conducted by students in pairs. Each student had the opportunity to be the facilitator as well as the participant. Affirming questions and storytelling were some of the techniques used to fulfill the goal of appreciative inquiry. The process of interviewing participants helped the students hone critical skills such as active listening, interpersonal, paraphrasing, and communication skills.









Field Visits

ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA

St. Catherines is an educational institute and rehabilitation space for destitute children founded by Father Anthony in 1957. The school we visited is located near Mount Mary Church, Bandra. Further there are branches located in Thane and Mahabaleshwar as well. Children from marginalized sects living on the street, in slums, and coming from villages are homed here.

Some programs in place are 1. Happy Feet which encourages yoga and dance 2. JO20+ provides job-oriented vocational training for professions like mechanics, nurses, driving, or beauty school. 3. Happy Home Project which empowers parents, and provides counseling and life skills lessons on alternate Sundays. St. Catherine in this manner provides more than just education but a haven to its children, watching over them like a guardian angel.

KRIPA FOUNDATION

Our next visit was to the Kripa Foundation, affiliated with the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MSJE), which is the largest NGO working in the fields of addiction and HIV/AIDS. It had humble beginnings in a church annex in Bandra in 1981 with one priest, an alcoholic, a doctor, and three patients. Their work has received national and international recognition.

Kripa has programs for street children that use the HALT Technique; it stands for hunger, anger, loneliness, and tiredness as reasons children turn to drugs. By providing for all the above-mentioned needs, they ensure children don't go back to using drugs recreationally. Lastly, they work with resistance with patience, determinism, and persistence; they don't give up on people, ever.

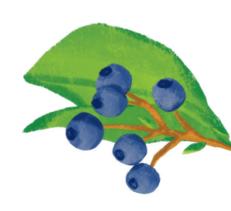

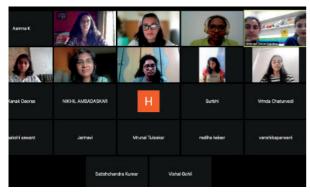

He also recounts his exemplary character in caring for his disabled mother. The silent story of his wife, whom he dared to love as a teenager, is also included. His speech had great impact.

MS. POOJA JOSHI BNP PARIBAS

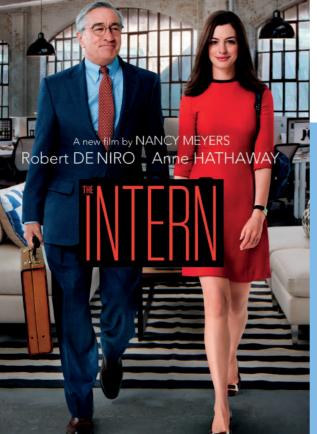

SULLY: MIRACLE ON THE HUDSONS





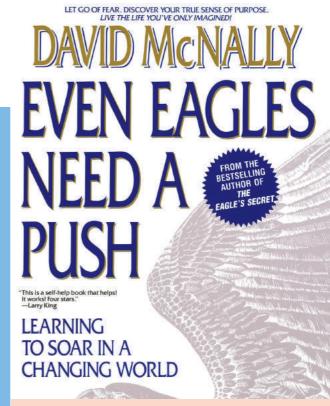

"INDIA IS A LAND OF PARADOXES"

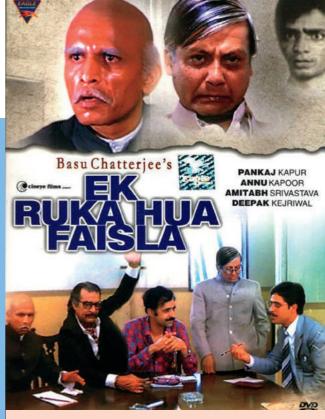

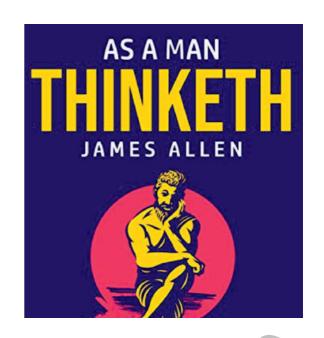


MAN'S SEARCH FOR MEANING

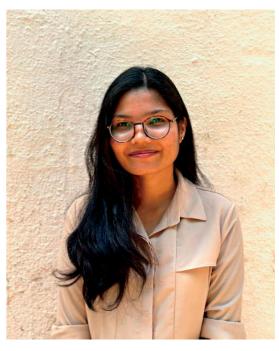

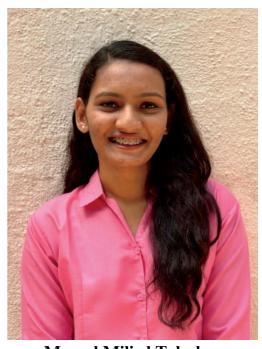

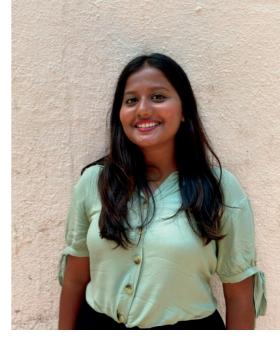
