### **Fiction Writing Task**

### **Poetry Writing Task**

Write a poem of at least 10 lines using strong imagery and sound devices.

Revise a given poem by changing its rhythm or adding alliteration.

### **Journaling & Writing Process**

Write a journal entry reflecting on a personal experience in a way that could be adapted into a short story.

### **Creative Non-Fiction Task**

Write a personal essay (400-500 words) on a meaningful event in your life.

Convert a personal anecdote into a memoir-style narrative with sensory details.

### **Digital Media Writing Task**

Write a microfiction piece (Twitter-style story in 280 characters).

Create a blog post on a topic of your choice (500 words), keeping audience engagement in mind.

### **Editing and Rewriting Task**

Given a poorly written passage, rewrite it using better storytelling techniques.

Edit a sample paragraph to improve clarity, coherence, and style.

### **Publication Process Task**

Draft a cover letter for submitting a short story to an online magazine.
