	Including but Not limited to:	fiction of the iconic Dalit writer and Lokshahir, Anna Bhau Sathe, who authored 35 Marathi novels. This course delves into how Sathe's narratives reflect the lived realities of the oppressed, the working class, and rural migrants. His novels are examined as instruments of protest, cultural assertion, and social transformation. Through close readings, students will engage with his bold portrayals of caste, class, and resistance. The course highlights Sathe's unique narrative voice shaped by folk traditions and oral storytelling. It situates his fiction within the broader spectrum of Dalit, Marxist, and anticolonial literary movements. Themes such as migration, urban poverty, dignity of labor, and collective struggle are critically analyzed. The course also explores the historical and political contexts that influenced Sathe's prose. Comparative discussions with global proletarian and resistance literature enrich the understanding of Sathe's significance. Ultimately, students gain insight into how his novels contribute to both regional and world literatures of the marginalized.

- To critically analyze the local to global themes, characters, and narrative structures used in his fiction.
- To explore how Sathe fuses folk oral traditions with prose to communicate with marginalized audiences.
- To assess the influence of caste, class, and Marxist ideology on his novelistic vision.
- To compare Sathe's works with global literary traditions of resistance and labor fiction.

8 Course Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Understand the thematic and structural diversity of Anna Bhau Sathe's novels.
- Analyze the literary strategies used to represent subaltern lives and resist hegemonic narratives.
- Identify connections between folk culture and written fiction in Dalit literature.

- Engage with translated versions of his novels and assess the challenges of cultural transference.
