

CIRCULAR :

A reference is invited to the Ordinances, Regulations and syllabi relating to the Bachelor of Science (I.T.) degree course *vide* pamphlet No.338 and to this office Circular No.UG/47 of 2004 dated 23rd April, 2004 and the Principals of the affiliated colleges in Arts, Science, Commerce and Professor-cum-Director, Institute of Distance Education are hereby informed that the proposal for guidelines, procedure for admission relating to the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course to be introduced from the academic year 2007-2008 has been accepted by the Academic Council at its meeting held on 12th June, 2007 *vide* item No.4.16 and subsequently approved by the Management Council at its meeting held on 15th June, 2007 *vide* item No.17 and that in accordance therewith Ordinances 5051 and 5053 relating to the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course has been amended to read as under :-

"O.5051 :- B.Sc.(Information Technology)

- a. A candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course of Bachelor of Science-Information Technology, shall have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or it's equivalent with Mathematic and Statistics as one of the subject and should have secured not less than 45% marks in aggregate for open category and 40% marks in aggregate in case of reserved category candidates.
- b. Candidate who have passed Diploma (Three years after S.S.C. Xth Std.) in Information Technology/ Computer Technology/ Computer Engineering/Computer Science/ Electrical, Electronics and Video Engineering and Allied Branches/Mechanical and Allied Branches/ Civil and Allied branches of are eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course.

However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body. Minimum marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

OR

Candidates with post HSC-Diploma in Information Technology/Computer Technology/ Computer Engineering/ Computer Science/ and Allied branches will be eligible for direct admission to the Second Year of B.Sc. (I.T.).

However, the Diploma should be recognized by the Board of Technical Education or any other recognized Government Body. Minimum Marks required 45% aggregate for open category candidates and 40% aggregate for reserved category candidates.

Intake capacity 60."

"O.5053 : B.Sc. (Information Technology)"

a. No common entrance test will be conducted.

Admission will be on merit, based on order of preference as follows:

1. Marks in Mathematics and Statistics at H.S.C. or equivalent.
 2. Aggregate Marks at H.S.C. (Std. XII) or equivalent.
 3. Aggregate Marks at S.S.C. (Std.X)
- b. The total enrollment of students will be restricted to 60 students per division at S.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.) and additional 6 seats per division can be offered for Diploma holders eligible for direct admission to S.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.).

However, if the repeaters are admitted in S.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.) or in T.Y.B.Sc. (I.T.) in addition to regular students of the same college, a new batch to be started if the strength exceeds 72 students subject to permission of University and Government.

Further, I am to inform you that in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Management Council under Section 54(1) of the Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994, it has amended the aforesaid Ordinance 5051 and 5053 relating to the B.Sc. (I.T.) degree course and that the same has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2007-2008.
