ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO CERTIFICATE COURSE IN ANCIENT INDIAN ARTS & SCIENCES

O... TITLE OF THE COURSE: - Certificate Course in Ancient Indian Arts and Sciences

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ELIGIBILITY: - A candidate for being eligible for admission to the Certificate Course in Ancient Indian Arts and Sciences must have passed Higher Secondary School Certificate examination (H.S.C.) (Standard XII) in any faculty conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education, Pune or any examination of any other body recognized as equivalent thereto.

R... **DURATION OF THE COURSE**: The Certificate Course in Ancient Indian Arts and Sciences will be taught in 120 hrs of theory, 4 Museum visits and 1 field visit. The course will be conducted only on Sundays for nine months.

There shall be an examination at the end of the course to be conducted by the Board of Extra-Mural Studies on behalf of the University.

R... The candidate will be examined in theory paper and four reports.

TEACHERS QUALIFICATION: M.A./M.Sc. experience in Archaeology and/or Ancient Indian Culture 5 years.
