ORDINANCES, REGULATIONS, SYLLABUS AND SCHEME OF **EXAMINTION** RELATING TO INTENSIVE DIPLOMA COURSE IN **ITALIAN**

(Introduced with effect from the academic year 2009-2010)

Ordinances, Regulations, Syllabus and scheme of examination relating to Intensive Diploma Course in Italian (introduced with effect from the academic year 2009-2010)

Introduction:

The Intensive Diploma course in Italian is being introduced from 2009-2010. The total number of hours of teaching, course content, eligibility, scheme of examination, standard of passing remain the same. The duration is of $4\frac{1}{2}$ months and the fees are different. This is keeping in mind student needs and demands of the job market.

05875: Nomenclature: Intensive Diploma Course in Italian.

05876: Eligibility: Certificate in Italian or Entrance Test (the same rules of standard of passing the Certificate in Italian examination conducted by the Mumbai University apply).

R<u>8/06</u>: *Objectives*:. To teach students an intermediate level of conversational and written skills in the Italian language. For details see syllabus.

R<u>9/07</u>: Duration: 4 1/2 months (December-April) in 2 terms with an intermediate test and a final exam.

R<u>\$108</u>: Weekly hours: 9 (3 hrs. three times a week). Total hours: 180.

R8109: Minimum number of students: 10.

R<u>8110</u>: Exam structure: see pattern in the Exam Structure section. A 70% of attendances is required to have access to the final exam.

R<u>8111</u>: Standard of passing: in order to qualify for the *Diploma* exam a candidate must obtain a minimum of 50% of the marks in the written paper (100 marks) and in the oral examination (50 marks) taken separately (at least 75 marks in total).

R8112: Scheme of Examination

R8113: Written paper: it will be a combination of different exercises to test The following with fixed marks are compulsory:

XXV) Grammar (50 marks);

XXVI) Vocabulary;

XXVII) Communication (answering to question on general topics of daily life);

SYLLABUS

Communication

The course develops skills like expressing opinions, making comparisons, discussing plans: what to do, where to go, how to order a meal, to give and receive information about quantities, numbers, prices, to ask and to answer questions about the past and the future, to make assumptions, to interact with others when travelling or working. Topics deal with social events, work, entertainment, shops, hotel, university, clothing, health and contemporary life in India and in Italy.

The course will enable the students to speak with ease in informal and formal situations, to understand texts of medium difficulty and to write short essays on different subjects.

Grammar

Beyond what is already included in the Syllabus of the previous level, the course will enable the students to understand and use the following structures of the Italian language.

Conjugation of the active and reflexive form of the regular and irregular verbs in the following tenses and modes: indicative past simple, past perfect, future simple, future perfect; subjunctive present and imperfect; conditional present; imperative.

Conjugation of passive form in the following tenses and modes: indicative present and past present; infinitive present and perfect.

Impersonal verbs. Verbs used as modal verbs. Impersonal si.

Position of the adjective. Comparative and superlative grade of adjectives and adverbs.

Use of ci and ne. Pronouns particles and combined pronouns. Pronouns with imperative.

Relative pronouns: subject and object, direct and indirect, with or without preposition.

Indefinite adjectives and pronouns.

The most common adverbs for opinion and doubt.

Use of stare per + infinitive.

Different uses of subjunctive.

The main clause sentence: volitional sentences with subjunctive, indicative and infinitive

The multiple clause sentence: a) coordinate clauses disjunctive, conclusive, correlative; b) subordinate clauses of purpose; of result; comparative; hypotethical 1°, 2° kind; of concession/contrast; relative.

Appropriate use of the most common conjunctions and of the tenses and modes required for these sentences.

Vocabulary The students should be able to read texts including words of vocabolario di base della lingua The structure of other lexical levels (up to 7% max.). but even production the students will be able to use words from lessico In oral and part of lessico di alta disponibilità, too.

Culture and Civilization
