DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

The University Department of History, University of Mumbai was established in 1969 in the Fort Campus. In June 1972 it shifted its premises to the new University Campus at Kalina.

The Department of History offers a two year post-graduate course leading to a Masters Degree by papers. A number of students who have been awarded M.A., M.Phil and Ph.D. degrees have gone on to make their own distinctive contribution in the field of History.

The Department regularly invites scholars both in History and other related disciplines to give talks and lectures to faculty and students and makes a special effort to reach out to college teachers of the many colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai. It consciously aims to build bridges and share information between College and University teachers with the intention to making the University of Mumbai a Centre of excellence in historical research and improve the quality of teaching at both levels.

The Department of History, University of Mumbai is fortunate to be located in the State Capital, which has also emerged as a global city. It is fitting therefore to state that the Department concentrates its research activities in Ancient, Medieval and Modern Indian History. While emphasis is placed on teaching and research in Indian History a great deal of importance is also given to studying developments in an international context, and studying the histories of specific countries such as Europe, U.S.A., China and West Asia.

PUBLIC LECTURES, FELLOWSHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS & PRIZES

History Department Fund (Endowment):

I. As a sequel to the successful hosting of the 41st Session of the Indian History Congress by the Department of History, University of Mumbai in 1980, a "History Department Fund (Endowment)" was created with a view to promoting historical studies and research.

The D. D. Kosambi Memorial Lectures:

The D.D. Kosambi Memorial Lectures were instituted in the year 1984-85. Eminent Historians and other scholars of repute are invited to deliver the lectures every alternate year which are regularly published by the Department.

Department Scholarships:

Two Department Merit Scholarships of the value of Rupees 1200/- per annum, are instituted for the students of the Department.

Department Seminar Library:

The S.R. Tikekar Collection donated to the Department has been developed into the History Department Seminar Library. Books, Journals, and other historical material are being added regularly to the Seminar Library for the use of the students and members of the faculty of the Department. Expenditure on new acquisitions is met from the Department of History Fund (Endowment).

II. Endowment Lectures:

- a) Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar Memorial Lectures, held every third year.

 Lectures are open to the Public.
 - b) Pandit Bhagwanlal Indraji Lectures, held every fifth year. Lectures are open to the Public.
- III. Pandit Setu Madhavrao Pagdi Felicitation Research Scholarships, instituted by the Government of Maharashtra of the value of Rs. 3,000/- per month to a senior scholar to promote research on the History of Maharashtra.
- IV. Professor J.V. Naik Book Prize instituted in the Department of History to be awarded to a student of Department who has secured the highest marks at the M.A. Part II examination held in the first half of the year.

ENROLMENT FOR M.A. DEGREE COURSE:

Holders of the B.A. degree of the university of Mumbai or any other recognized Indian University who have majored in History or have studied at least two papers in History at the graduate level are eligible for admission to the M.A. Degree in History. Students who have not offered at least two papers in History at the Graduate level, but are seeking admission to the M.A. (History) programme will have to appear for an admission test. The test will be the same as given to the graduates from the faculties other than the faculty of Arts, seeking admission to the M.A. History programme. The decision of granting admission will be made by the Head of the Department.

Graduates from other Universities seeking admission to the M.A. History programme are required to first obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the Registrar, University of Mumbai. The Registrar may issue a provisional statement of Eligibility if he is satisfied that the applicant is *prima facie* eligible for admission. Having obtained the provisional statement of eligibility, a student may seek provisional admission to this University, and on condition that he submits to the Registrar's Office through the Head of the Department, the necessary certificates in original together with a typed/ Xeroxed copy of each for confirmation of his eligibility before the close of the academic term in which the student is provisionally admitted to the University.

ADMISISON OF THE SC/ST/BC STUDENTS:

Admission of the students belonging to the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, backward communities and denotified tribes will be regulated by the special provisions pertaining to them made by the competent authorities at the time of their applying.

REGISTRATION:

All candidates for post-graduate Degree (History) are required to register themselves by submitting their registration forms along with the prescribed fees:

M.A. - Rs. 800/-

M.Phil. - Rs. 1,000/-

Ph.D. - Rs. 1,000/-

(or as may be notified by the University from time to time). Fees for registration as post-graduate student once received will not be refunded.

No student can register himself simultaneously for more than one post-graduate degree.

Fresh Admission: History graduates of the Mumbai University seeking admission to the department, shall submit their applications to the Head of the Department in the prescribed form along with the original statement of marks obtained at the B.A. Examination and a certified copy of the same. History graduates of Universities other than University of Mumbai, shall submit—

- 1. Original Statement of Marks obtained at the B.A. Examination and a certified copy of the same.
- 2. Provisional Eligibility Certificate obtained from the Registrar, University of Mumbai.

Students selected for admission shall pay the prescribed fees within the prescribed time limit, which will be notified to them. They shall also submit an application for post-graduate registration with the prescribed fees within the prescribed time limit.

- 3. Transference Certificate; If a students wishes to transfer himself/ herself to the Department from a constituent college of the University of Mumbai, a Transference Certificate must be obtained from the Principal of the College.
- 4. Migration Certificate: Students coming from Universities other than University of Mumbai shall produce a Migration Certificate for the confirmation of admission.

Admission for Graduates from Faculties other than the Faculty of Arts:

Graduates from the Faculties other than the Faculty of Arts as well as graduates from the Faculty of Arts, who have not offered at least two papers in History at the graduate level, seeking admission for M.A. in History will have to apply to the Head of the Department. The application should be accompanied by the certified copies of their graduation certificate/ marksheet. Students belonging to Universities other than the University of Mumbai should also submit the Eligibility Certificate along with their application. The Eligibility Certificate should be obtained from the Registrar, University of Mumbai. Such candidate will have to appear for an admission test consisting of two papers, conducted by the Department, as under:

- a) An Essay paper in the subject: Six topics on different aspects of Indian / World History will be given for essay writing. A candidate will have to attempt any one of them.
- b) A paper to test the student's general acquaintance with the subject, This paper will consist of 8 short questions on Indian/World History. A candidate will have to attempt any four of them. The test in both the papers will be held at one time only. Duration of the test will be of three hours.

Time for Admission: Admission to the M.A. degree course in History will be made only at the beginning of the academic year on the dates notified by the University.

Renewal of Admission: M.A. Part I students who wish to continue in the Department for their M.A. Part II studies, are required to renew their admission within one week of the

commencement of the academic year of before such date as is notified in that behalf by the University by submitting application for renewal, in the prescribed form, along with the term fees.

TUITION FEES:

The Tuition fees per annum shall be Rs. 1,000/- (For Foreign Students the prescribed Tuition Fee is Rs. 5,000/- per annum) plus Rs. 10/- as Students Union Fee (or as may be decided by the University from time to time). Tuition Fees must be paid in full at the time of admission to the Department. The Department office will issue bank challans to the students for payment of their tuition fees or any other dues in the specified bank. (The office of the Department will not accept cash, cheques or postal order towards payment of Tution Fees or any other dues). Admission will be finalized only after the production of a bank receipt in payment of the Tuition Fees. The Tuition Fees once paid shall not be refunded even if the student fails to continue in the Department.

CAUTION MONEY:

A sum of Rs. 10/- will be charged as Caution Money Deposit from every student joining the Department. This amount will be returned when the student leaves the Department, provided that the student has paid in full all claims against him.

The refund of caution money deposit should be claimed within a year from the date of leaving the Department. Caution money not claimed within the prescribed period is liable to be forfeited.

RULES FOR ADMISSION TO M.A. DEGREE EXAMINATION BY PAPERS:

(a) Keeping of terms and attendance: The student should have satisfactorily completed two terms to be eligible for admission to the M.A. Part I examination. Further, the student will have to keep two more terms to become eligible for admission to the M.A. Part II Examination. However, no student is permitted to appear for M.A. Part II Examination unless he/she has first passed his/her M.A. Part I Examination.

Attendance at Lectures, Seminars/Discussions is compulsory. Students shall not be granted terms unless they put in required attendance at Lectures, Seminars/Discussions as per University rules.

(b) Sending up the Examination Form:

(1) Students registered in the Department shall submit at the specified time their examination forms to the Head of the Department for certifying and forwarding the same to the Registrar/Controller of Examinations, University of Mumbai for admission to the Examination.

- Those students who have taken admission through the affiliated colleges of the University of Mumbai shall submit their Examination Forms at the specified time to the Principals of the respective colleges for certifying and forwarding the same to the Registrar/Controller of Examination, for admission to the examination. Before certifying the Examination forms the Principal shall ascertain from the Head of the Department that the concerned student has been granted terms.
- (c) Obtaining of B.A. Degree: Conferment of Bachelor Degree at the Convocation is a condition precedent for admission to a Master's degree examination.

EXAMINATION FEES:

M.A. Part I Rs. 450/- + Rs. 10/- as form fees + Rs. 50/- for Statement of Marks (Total Rs. 510/-)

(Or as may be notified by the University from time to time)

Refund of Examination Fees: Where a candidate is taken ill subsequent to the submission of his application for admission to the examination, is prevented on medical grounds from appearing at the examination, half the fees shall be refunded to him/her. This shall be provided on application for such refund, supported by a medical certificate submitted through the Head of the Department/ the Principal, as the case may be, so as to reach the Registrar within three days from the date of commencement of the examination.

Note: By the expression "date of commencement of examination" is meant the date on which the first paper at the examination is set and not a date on which the candidate has to appear for his first paper.

M.Phil Degree:

The details regarding M.Phil (History) degree course are to be found in the M.Phil prospectus which is available in the office of the Department.

M.Phil candidates should familiarize themselves with the University regulations governing the M.Phil programme.

Ph.D. Degree:

Admission of Research Students: Owing to the limited number of seats, students seeking admission to the Department as a research student should note that they are not entitled to such admission merely because they fulfill the minimum qualifications admissible under

the rules. It is for the teachers at the Department to decide each case on its merit, subject to:-

1. (i) The consent of the Head of the Department; and

(ii) The Rules of the University for the registration of research students.

Ph.D. candidates should familiarize themselves with the University Ordinances governing the Ph.D. programme. Research students can be registered for Ph.D. programme any time during the academic year.

- 2. Research students are required (if they have not already done so) to submit to the University office the title of their research not later than one year from the date of registration as Ph.D./ M.A. (By Research) students. In submitting the titles of the problems of their research, students are required to state in their application the degree for which they have registered as also the date of registration. Such applications have to be duly endorsed by the guiding teachers; and forwarded to the University Registrar, through the Head of the Department.
- 3. Renewal of Admission: All the Research Students are required to renew their admission each term within a week of the opening of the term by submitting the prescribed form along with the term fees. The applications for renewal must be countersigned by the guiding teacher and the Head of the Department.
- 4. Ph.D. students should ordinarily submit their thesis on the completion of the minimum period prescribed for the course (Two calendar years or four academic terms). No student shall be permitted to continue their Ph.D. work in the Department/recognized Institution after the lapse of the prescribed period without the special permission of the University.
- 5. At least one month (or the time-limit that may be prescribed by the University) before the submission of their thesis, the concerned research students are required to submit through the Head of the recognized Institution in which they are registered, to the Registrar, University of Mumbai, the requisite number of copies of the synopsis of their thesis, duly certified by their research guides, together with the prescribed examination fees.
- 6. A student who has submitted a synopsis of his/her thesis must submit his/her thesis within a period of six months thereafter. An extension may be granted, in special cases, not exceeding three months. If a research students fails to submit his/her thesis within the prescribed time limit of six months since the date of submission of his/her synopsis, he/she shall be required to pay a fresh fee for admission to the examination.
- 7. While submitting thesis for the Ph.D. degree, students are required to submit through their guiding teacher, abstracts of their thesis for publication in the University Journal. Further, if and when the thesis is published elsewhere, a copy of the reprint

- along with the reference to the Journal wherein it is published, or a copy of the publication must be submitted to the University.
- 8. The obtaining of Master's degree at the Convocation is a condition precedent to the admission to the Doctor's degree examination.
- 9. A research student who submits his/her thesis during the vacations shall not be required to pay the tuition fee for the following term.
- 10. The period for which a person is registered for the Ph.D. will be counted strictly from the date of his/her registration. The period, if any, put in previous to the registration will not be given any credit.

LIBRARY:

Two Libraries are maintained by the University: One is Jawaharlal Nehru Library at the Vidyanagari Campus and the other, the older one, University Library at the Fort Campus,

Application forms for Reader's Ticket are available in both the Libraries. Application for Reader's Ticket should be submitted through the Head of the Department.

Student should familiarize themselves with the University Library rules governing -

- (i) Reading facility in the Library
- (ii) Lending of the Books
- (iii) Special Facility to the Research Students.

All the information regarding the library may be obtained from the Librarian, University of Mumbai.

Students will have to pay Library fees of Rs. 400/- per term or as may be decided by the University from time to time.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FREE STUDENTSHIPS:

A few merit scholarships and free studentships are available for M.A. as well as Ph.D. students. While the merit scholarships will be awarded on the basis of examination results and class work, the award of free studentships will be governed primarily by the financial condition of the candidate.

Applications for both kinds of awards should be submitted to the Head of the Department by the date prescribed.

The fellowships will be paid monthly in arrears on submitting a bill. A certificate of regular attendance and satisfactory progress from the guiding teacher should accompany the bill.

STUDENTS UNION:

The Students Union of the Departments was first formed in 1933, with the purpose of promoting the cultural, social and corporate life of the students of the Departments. The new Constitution of the Students Union, framed in 1974, is available at the Students Union Office for consultation.

UNIVERSITY HOSTELS:

The Boys Hostels are maintained by the University of Mumbai for the students of the Departments of he University – at Churchgate and Vidyanagari Campus, Kalina, with limited number of seats. The University also maintains a Girl's Hostel at Kalina Campus with limited number of seats.

Students seeking admission to the Hostel are required to fill in the form of application which must be submitted to the Warden before the beginning of the academic term for which the admission is sought. The form should be forwarded through the Head of the Department. The allocation of seats in the Hostel will be notified on the Hostel notice-board at the beginning of each term. The Warden does not undertake correspondence / the allocation of seats or to discuss the same with the applicant.

Rules and regulations regarding the Hostel rent and other charges as determined by the University authorities can be obtained from the Warden of the respective Hostels. Students otherwise eligible for admission to the Hostel may be admitted during a vacation, if such admission is sought for academic purpose. Applications for such admission will be received upto 10th March for the summer vacation, and 1st October for the winter vacation. (Or before the dates that may be notified on the Notice Board). Applications received after these days will not be considered.

Hostel rates are subject to the changes that may be notified by the University from time to time.

SCHEME OF M.A. TEACHING AND EXAMINATION IN HISTORY

Scheme 'A'

Examination under this scheme will be conducted by the University at the end of the academic year.

University Circular No.215 of 1981, dated 14th April, 1981.

A Student who appears for Part I or Part II of the Master of Arts degree examination and gives a declaration in writing to the University through the Head of the University Department/ Principal of the College/ Head of the Constituent recognized Institution through which he is sent up for the examination, within one week of the close of the examination, to the effect that his result of the Part I or the Part II examination, as the case my be, be considered null and void if he does not obtain (a) the percentage of marks laid down for the award of a Second Class at the M.A. Degree examination, or (b) at least 55 per cent marks on the aggregate – (which is a requirement at the Masters degree examination laid down by the University Grants Commission for appointment of a teacher), or (c) the percentage of marks laid down for the award of a First Class at the M.A. degree examination, will be declared as failed at the examination for the Part concerned if he does not obtain in the Part (a) the percentage of marks laid down for the award of Second Class or (b) at least 55 per cent marks or (c) the percentage of marks laid down for the award of a First Class at the M.A. degree examination, as the case may be, so as to enable him to improve his performance at the examination.


