Attention of the Principals of the affiliated colleges in the faculty of Science and the Directors/Heads of the recognized institutions concerned are hereby invited to the Ordinances, Regulations and syllabi relating to the Master of Science (M.Sc. Parts I & II) degree course vide pamphlet No.175 and to this office Circular No.UG/311 of 2002, dated 23rd July, 2002 and they are hereby informed that the recommendation made by the Board of Studies in Biochemistry at its meeting held on 10th March, 2004 has been accepted by the Academic Council at its meeting held on 18th June, 2004 vide item No.4.1 and that in accordance therewith the following explanation is given regarding "Industrial Visit" which has been introduced from the academic year 2004-2005 in the revised pattern of the existing syllabus of Biochemistry at the M.Sc. degree (By-papers) vide University Circular No.UG/311 of 2002 dated 23rd July, 2002 :-

INDUSTRIAL VISIT :-

- a) Students of M.Sc. Part I and Part II will be required to go for a two or three days visit to the industry or research institutions located in an around Mumbai or in Maharashtra or any other State/Union Territory (UT) in India.
- b) Such industries should preferably be the manufacturing units of pharmaceuticals, food and food processing, bulk/fine bio-chemicals, beverage, oils, etc. and the research institutions of national and international repute.
- c) A two-page summary of the industrial visit be entered by each student in the journal as a part of Practical IV at M.Sc. Part I and Practical VIII at M.Sc. Part II.
- d) Students of M.Sc. Part I and Part II may be clubbed together for a common industrial visit.
- e) In case of such visits, the days spent on actual visit as well as those in travelling may be considered together for granting Special/Duty Leave to the staff member(s) accompanying the students.
- f) Teacher(s) permitted for such visits shall be two teachers per a group of ten students or part thereof and preferably one Lady teacher be included.

Students and the accompanying teachers may be eligible to claim concessional fares as per the prevailing rules while travelling by Railway/State Transport (ST)/Air/Sea route.

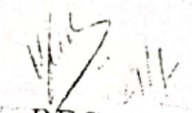
