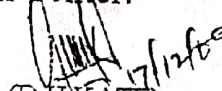

Ordinances, Regulations, Scheme and Syllabus for the the Degree of Master of Arts in Education (M.A. in Education)

O. 58.84 Title of Course : Master of Arts in Education (M.A. in Education)

ELIGIBILITY

O. 58.85 Any person who has passed the degree of Bachelor of Arts in Education or Bachelor of Education of this University or a degree of another University recognized as equivalent with minimum of 45 % and 40% for reserved categories may be admitted to the Degree of Master of Arts in Education (M.A. in Ed.) after having fulfilled the requirements as laid down in the Ordinances and Regulations as prescribed in the course of studies for the Degree of Master of Education (M.A. in Ed.).

R. 81.51 The M.A. in Education degree shall be taken by Papers.
M.A Part I will comprise of **Four Compulsory Papers** and M.A. Part II will comprise of **Four Special Papers**.

R. 81.52 : Duration
The duration of the course shall be two academic years for the full-time course.

Examination.

R. 81.53 A Candidate desirous of appearing for the M.A. in Education examination shall undergo a regular course of study in University Department of Education or the Institute of Distance Education of the University of Mumbai or an institution recognized by the University Of Mumbai for the purpose.

The M.A. in Education examination will be held in the First Half of the year.

R. 81.54 The scheme of examination shall be as follows:

Part A: Theory Papers: There shall be four Compulsory Papers and two Electives from Group A as Papers V and VI and two Electives from Group B as Papers VII and VIII to be selected from the list of Special Papers. Each paper is of 100 marks of which 80 marks will be assigned to University Examination and 20 marks will be assigned to internal assignment. The duration of each theory paper will be two and a half hours.

Part B: Internal Assessment: For internal assessment there will be two assignments in each paper. In all, there will be 16 assignments to be submitted by students. The assignments comprise of 20% weightage in each paper. Students will have to submit all the assignments before appearing for their University examination.

STANDARD FOR PASSING THE EXAMINATION

R. 8154-A To pass the examination the candidate must obtain:

- a) In part A, minimum 25% of marks separately in each paper and 40% of marks in aggregate.
- b) With respect to the total marks obtained by the candidate in Part A: Papers of the examination (out of total 640), and in Part B: Internal Assessment (out of total 160) class will be accorded to the candidates for the total 800 marks is as follows

Class	Percentage	Marks
1 st Class with Distinction	70% and above	560 and above
1 st Class	60% to 69%	480 - 559
2 nd Class	50% to 59%	400 - 479
Pass Class	40% to 49%	320 - 399
Fail	Below 40%	319 and below

The class will be awarded on the basis of the total performance of parts A and B taken together

R. 8155 ----- If the candidate fails in theory papers, the marks in internal assessment will be carried over, at his/her option, to three subsequent examinations. Candidates exercising this option will not be eligible for First or Second Class.

R. 8156 ----- If the candidate fails in theory and wishes to reappear for the M.A. in Education examination will be eligible for the First or Second Class subject to his/her completing all the internal assignments and fulfilling the conditions (a) and (b) as specified under R. 4326 below.

IMPROVEMENT OF PERFORMANCE

R. 8157 ----- Candidates who have passed the M.A. in Education degree examination of this University and who desire to improve their performance will be permitted to appear again for the M.A. in Education degree examination for not more than period of 2 years from the date of his/her 1st appearing at M.A. in Education exam, subject to the following.

The conditions of passing the exam prevailing at the time of improvement will be applicable in such cases.

- a) Putting in attendance for one term for the full-time course.
- b) Completing all the assignments for the internal assessment.
