**Pattern of Question Paper
at the
Master of Social Work
in Parts I and II
Examinations**

(With effect from First Half of the year 2007)

Scheme of Question Papers: MSW I and MSW II

The internal assessment will be done by the teachers who teach the subject, and the marks of written assignments and tests will be communicated to the students except in Research Project/Term paper and Field Work.

The external examination carrying 60 per cent of the total marks assigned to the subject will cover the entire syllabus prescribed for the respective papers.

- a) paper carrying 60 marks for external examination will be of 3 hours duration
- b) A paper carrying 30 marks for external examination will be of 2 hours duration

The total number of questions for each paper carrying a total of 50 marks shall be six. The first question will be compulsory and allotted 9 marks. Of the remaining five questions, which will carry 7 marks each, the students shall answer any three questions. Each paper will contain a minimum of one question out of the remaining five, which will be short notes and it may have internal choice.

The total number of questions for each paper carrying a total of 100 marks shall be eight, out of which the students shall attempt five questions carrying equal marks. Each paper will contain a minimum of one question, which will be short notes and may have internal choice.
