O - 5544 TITLE OF THE COURSE :

UNDER - GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN MEDICAL RADIOGRAPHY

O - 5545 ELIGIBILITY :

- a) Candidates who are XII (10+2) std. pass with at least 45% aggregate marks.
- b) Those candidates who are in service as a radiographer in a public institution and having at least 3 years of experience.
- c) Those candidates who are working as radiographer in a private hospital/clinic and having at least 3 years of experience.
- d) Application of persons working in public hospitals must be forwarded through the hospital authorities.

R - 5210 DURATION OF THE COURSE : 2 Years

R - 5211 INTAKE CAPACITY :

- Batch of 25 (Twenty Five) Students - with 10% cover when necessary.

R - 5212 SELECTION PROCEDURE:

There will be a written test and personal interview. Academic qualification and credentials will be taken into account.

R - 5213 STANDARD OF PASSING :

Rules for qualifying for the Diploma Course in Medical Radiography :

Semester I : Two theory papers of 100 marks each with minimum of 50% marks in each paper is required. Those who are unsuccessful, can attend the second semester but will have to appear for supplementary exam. Maximum of two supplementary exams will be conducted for unsuccessful candidates. If the candidate fails in second supplementary exam he/she will be examined with the fresh batch next year.

Semester II : One theory paper of 100 marks and practical examination of 200 marks with minimum of 50% marks under each head is required.
For the unsuccessful candidates, two supplementary examinations will be conducted. Meanwhile he will continue attending Semester III. If the candidate fails in second supplementary exam he/she will be examined with the fresh batch next year.

Semester III : One theory paper of 100 marks and practical examination of 200 marks with minimum of 50% marks under each head is required. For the unsuccessful candidates, two supplementary examinations will be conducted. Meanwhile he/she will continue attending Semester IV. If the candidate fails in second supplementary exam he/she will be examined with the fresh batch next year.

Semester IV : One theory paper of 100 marks and practical examination of 100 marks with minimum of 50% marks under each head is required. For the unsuccessful candidates, two supplementary examination will be conducted. Failing which candidate has to appear for the regular batch semester IV exam.

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
