Introduction

The key objective of including project work is to incorporate the element of research work, which will test the learner's eagerness to learn and capacity to describe specific aspects of the study in his/her perspective. Guidelines for the Preparation of Project Work

- The project topic may be undertaken from any topic given in the project paper or related to history subject.
- Each of the learners has to undertake a Project individually
- The learner must choose a topic and title that are precise, clear, and have a clear objective
- The Project Component will be evaluated for 75 marks and Internal assessment will be conducted for 25 marks.
- The project report shall be prepared as per the broad guidelines given below:
 - ➤ The project has to be submitted in the Handwritten Format on One Side Ruled A4 Sizesheets already provided in the project manual.
 - ➤ The Project should be of 30-40 pages.
 - > The Project shall be submitted in PDF format and uploaded on the link that willbe provided by the service provider.
 - The Size of the PDF File should be between 15MB-20MB.
 - Projects should be submitted within the time frame announced by the Institute.
 - Any delays in the Project submission will not be entertained.
- In case of failing in the project work, the same project can be revised for ATKT examination.
- NO VIVA VOCE/PRESENTATIONS will be conducted by the Institute

Structure of the Project Work

• Chapter No. 1: Introduction

In this chapter, a brief introduction about the theme of your project, the relevance of the problem, its historical background, a brief profile of the study area, definition/s of related aspects, characteristics, scope, and the importance of the theme and significance of the study can be mentioned.

• Chapter No. 2: Literature Review

This chapter will provide information about previous studies/research that has been already conducted in the area. This would specify how the study undertaken is relevant and contributes to value addition in information/knowledge/application of the study area which ultimately helps the learner to undertake further study on the same issue. It is necessary to cite the article and mention the sources.

• Chapter No. 3: Research Methodology

This chapter will include:

- a. **Objectives** Research Objectives refer to the outcomes that you aim to find out while conducting the research in a concise manner. Make sure the research objectives are specific, clearly mentioned, and leave no space for any confusion, are measurable, realistic, and relevant. It is advisable to always put your objectives in bullet form.
- b. **Methods of Data collection**: In this section, you will write the sources of the secondary data from which the data will be gathered. Secondary Data will have two parts: Journals, reports from official websites, previous research that is conducted, and Books.
- **Tabulation of data:** Once the data is collected you can present the same using tables, pie charts, graphs, etc. can help to provide a better representation. It is important to mention the source from which the diagrams, tables, and charts have been taken.

• Chapter No. 4: Project Topic

In this chapter, the learner will add all the information, and data collected from the primary as well as secondary sources, internet sources, related images, graphs, etc.

• Chapter No. 5: Conclusions

In this chapter conclusions will be provided along with the Limitations of the study, as well as scope for further research can be provided.

Note: If required more chapters of data analysis can be added.

References – This will include the list of the books, journals, articles, magazines, newspapers, websites, etc. used while undertaking the research. The Bibliography has to be mentioned in the APA format.

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• **Appendix-** It shall contain a list of supplementary material which may be helpful in providing further support for the research undertaken.
